LOCATION

Located in the Upstate region of South Carolina along I-85, Anderson is the midway point between Charlotte, NC and Atlanta, GA. Almost 190,000 people have chosen to live in Anderson County for the area’s warm Southern climate, beautiful lakes, and opportunity for a better quality of life.

Southern Business & Development recently ranked Anderson, SC in the top 25 in the region as one of the “Best Places in the South to Locate Your Company.”

ONE OF THE “HOTTEST AREAS IN THE NATION”

Location. Location. Location. With more than 37 miles of Interstate frontage, the “Boom Belt” I-85, is a primary pull to the area. However, location is only part of the story in making Anderson County attractive to companies. Business and Industry also profit from the County’s low taxes and quality labor force.

CLEMSON UNIVERSITY—ADVANCED MATERIALS CENTER

The Clemson University-Advanced Materials Center is a focal point for leading-edge material discovery, characterization, and application. It is anchored by a state-of-the-art research facility and will continue to be a major magnet for private sector partnerships.

At the heart of the 260+ acre campus is the 111,000 square foot Advanced Materials Research Laboratory. The AMRL holds some of the world's brightest researchers, using state-of-the-art equipment. BOOMING COMMERCIAL CLIMATE

Retail and commercial announcements have boomed in the area. An updated listing of national retail chains and businesses is available through the Anderson County Office of Economic Development.

DOWNTOWN REVITALIZATION

The City of Anderson's revitalization efforts and development incentives have also primed Main Street and surrounding historic areas for commercial, office and retail development. Wide walkways lead around a mix of old and new – from colorful new eateries and art galleries, to the classic architecture of businesses built more than 50 to 100 years ago.

Many buildings are available for lease or purchase in the downtown area and the City of Anderson offers several incentives to help an entrepreneur thrive in the newly-preserved townscape.

DOWNTOWN BUSINESS INCENTIVES

The City of Anderson promotes planned, high-quality development in several ways. Providing financial incentives for those companies that qualify is one strategy the city uses to enhance the area's growth and future.

CITY OF ANDERSON BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT REVOLVING LOAN FUND

The City of Anderson created a Business Development Department to aid and attract businesses within the downtown and five specified redevelopment areas. Loans are made to existing or prospective businesses for start-up capital, purchase of equipment, expansion of existing business, or acquisition. This program is federally funded from the Department of Housing and Urban Development and does not have stipulations regarding location and job creation.

DOWNTOWN FACADE GRANT PROGRAM

To continue to enhance the revitalization of downtown Anderson, the City offers up to \$2,500 per storefront in matching funds to upgrade downtown building facades.

Grants are offered on a first-come, first-served basis and are available annually. Program guidelines and applications are available via the city website at www.downtownanderson.com

PUBLIC-PRIVATE COMMITMENT TO JOB CREATION AND INVESTMENT

In the spirit of the rapidly growing Anderson economy, community leaders and County and City government are enthusiastically committed to economic development. Innovate Anderson specifically markets Anderson's resources and enhances overall development and quality of life features. Innovate Anderson focuses on creating jobs and investment within Anderson County in three main initiatives: marketing collaboration with the County's Economic Development Office (EDO), the Anderson Convention and Visitors Bureau, and their product development work at the Clemson University- Advanced Materials Center.

THE UPSTATE—AN INTERNATIONAL BUSINESS HUB

With more than 240 international companies located in the Upstate, 10 percent of which are located in Anderson, the area boasts one of the highest concentrations of international business in the nation.

TECHNICAL TRAINING

Many companies recruit employees who have received specialized technical training from area technical schools, including nearby Tri-County Technical College.

READYSC

With little or no cost, the state's ReadySC program gives hands-on, high-tech training customized to new or expanding employers' needs. The company's production process determines the curriculum.



ANDERSON COUNTY SCHOOLS

Excellence in education is the focus of the five school districts in the county. The districts operate thirty elementary schools, ten middle schools, eight high schools, and various career centers and child development programs.

Private Schools

There are also several area private and/or parochial schools that feature day-care centers, preschools, and kindergartens.

Higher Education

With more than 15 universities and colleges within a 50 mile radius of Anderson, there are many premium higher education options for students. Anderson University is a private, co-educational, Christian liberal arts institution affiliated with the South Carolina Baptist Convention, which offers degree programs at the undergraduate level and post graduate level. Tri-County Technical College is a public two-year, associate degree awarding college. Clemson University, well-known for its research, engineering and agricultural programs, as well as its sports, enrolls more than 17,000 students. Forrest Junior College was founded in 1946 and provides Associates Degrees in Medical Assistance, Criminal Justice and Business Administration with seven options for specialization: childcare management, computer repair and service, paralegal studies, office administration, medical office administration, accounting, and legal office administration. The college also offers continuing education programs geared toward computer-related training, Computer Repair and Service and allied health programs, CNA Certified Nursing Assistance.

RECREATION

Anderson County offers more recreation options than most communities. The surrounding lakes offer thousands of acres perfectly suited for boating, fishing, swimming, kayaking, canoe-

ing, and general entertaining. There are many lake lots available for housing, with only a short drive to most businesses. The climate is also a plus when playing on the lake or playing on the more than 75 golf courses located in the Upstate.

In 2008, Lake Hartwell hosted the “Super Bowl of Fishing,” The Bassmaster Classic. 50 of the nation’s best anglers competed for three days on the 56,000 acre lake for the \$500,000 top prize. The Classic was televised on ESPN for 13 hours over three days.

ATTRACTIONS, ARTS & ENTERTAINMENT

Anderson County has filled the sky with past events such as Freedom Weekend Aloft, the National Hot Air Balloon Championship, and most recently the “Snowbirds over Anderson” air show.

Anderson County fosters the arts in many ways- from visual to performing arts. The community now has a central facility to nurture different forms of arts with the Arts Center Warehouse. This historic and refurbished structure also houses the Anderson Convention & Visitors Bureau. It is also home to Anderson’s own Farmers Market, allowing local farmers to sell their goods to local restaurants and citizens.

The T. Ed Garrison Arena is recognized as one of the premier multi-purpose livestock facilities in the Southeast. The Arena is South Carolina’s only full service, public facility designed to promote the state’s billion-dollar livestock industry. Operated by the Cooperative Extension Service in the division of Public Service and Agriculture at Clemson University, the Arena provides opportunities for shows, sales, exhibits, and educational programs, which benefit those in agriculture and agribusiness and the youth of South Carolina. These events draw thousands of visitors to Anderson and South Carolina, boost tourism, and contribute to economic development not only in the upstate, but also throughout the entire state of South Carolina.

ANDERSON SPORTS & ENTERTAINMENT CENTER

In addition to hosting many annual events, the ASEC is the main recreational hub for the County. With an 14,000-seat amphitheater, a Sports Center for hosting baseball, softball, soccer, tennis tournaments and a 37,000-square-foot Civic Center, ASEC offers entertainment and recreation venues for everyone. 

ANDERSON COUNTY AND UPSTATE SC POPULATION TRENDS, 1980 - 2030













1980 - 2005 HOUSEHOLDS




HOUSING UNITS, 1980-2005

PERSONS PER HOUSEHOLD, 1980-2005



MEDIAN FAMILY INCOME, 1997-2006



WORK FORCE

LABOR AVAILABILITY

The Anderson area has a potential labor pool consisting of several groups: underemployed, unemployed, those turning age 18, college students, college graduates, and commuters.

THE UNDEREMPLOYED

A significant number of potential employees are the underemployed- defined as potentially available workers who would change jobs or might re-enter the work force for the right opportunity. These people possess the skills, education, and experience to qualify them for a better job.

THE UNEMPLOYED

The unemployed comprise a large group of potential employees including those who have been laid-off or terminated. This "labor shed" of available employees sits ready to re-engage in the workforce.

THOSE TURNING AGE 18

One of the largest groups of potential employees is considered those turning age 18 each year in the Upstate. Out of this group, approximately 66% attend college, but the remaining 34% enter directly into the workforce.

COLLEGE STUDENTS

Those attending colleges in the Upstate account for an enrollment of more than 75,000 potential interns and co-op partners, as well as part time and/or seasonal employees. This pool of potential employees gives area industry a low cost alternative for quality white collar support positions. Additionally, many co-op students are prime candidates as potential employees.

COLLEGE GRADUATES

There are many colleges and universities in the Upstate producing more than 15,000 graduates per year. Out of these college graduates, the region boasts one of the highest concentrations of MBAs in the nation.

COMMUTERS

Commuters both into and out of the Upstate provide a prime source of labor. The fact that the Upstate can attract a large group of employees from other counties is a testament to the strength of the area's economy. Many companies successfully recruit from the labor markets of Charlotte and Atlanta.




TCEP COMPONENTS

The Tri-County Economic Partnership focuses on three key areas: 1) Information Services; 2) Collaborative Services; and 3) Small Business & Entrepreneurial Services.

Information Services will address the data and information

needs of economic developers, potential entrepreneurs, and the College’s business training providers and curriculum developers. Through strategic use of proprietary databases, contract research with national experts and other regional analytics, an expert researcher on the TCEP staff will produce practical, relevant and timely information products for TCEP customers. In addition, TCEP will provide market analysis services for prospective entrepreneurs and maintain databases of key information needed by small business owners (e.g., codes).

Collaborative Services will facilitate the identification of regional trends and opportunities that will enhance economic vitality through small business and entrepreneurship. A key strategy will be using the expertise and insights of local experts (economic developers, business/community leaders, etc.) to provide context for research produced through TCEP’s Information Services component. A second strategy will be to facilitate networking between key players in small business development – entrepreneurs, investors, owners of companies that could become suppliers, etc. Collaborative Services will also develop, host, or partner with other organizations to offer community events that promote small business and entrepreneurship.

Small Business & Entrepreneurial Services will be delivered through an established service center focusing on four types of clients:

1. Those with an idea for a new product or service who need assistance to bring it to market;
2. Those who want to own/run a small business but aren’t sure what type of business;
3. Those who currently own/run a small business and need assistance to “survive” and grow; and
4. Those who have an idea for a new product but don’t want to start a business themselves – i.e., they want to sell the idea to an entrepreneur or receive royalties.

The Center for Small Business and Entrepreneurship will offer comprehensive services and support such as:

1. Incubator services (starting in manufacturing-related areas).
2. Mentoring and training up to and through the incubation phase.

3. Mentoring, “Small Business 911” services, etc. for current business owners to help them survive and grow their businesses during critical phases.
4. Referral for specific assistance provided by other organizations such as Clemson Small Business Development Center, SCORE, local chambers, Anderson University, Southern Wesleyan University, etc.
5. Product enhancement support (to help existing small manufacturers [initially] bring new or enhanced products to market via rapid prototyping or other methods).
6. Resource Center services (print and online).
7. Competitions, mini-grant awards, “success story” profiles in the media, etc. to help encourage small business development, to gain PR exposure for TCEP, and to help brand the region as “entrepreneur/small business friendly.”
8. Workshops and short-term, non-credit courses addressing a wide range of needs for all four types of clients. (Courses could be offered through TCTC’s Con’t Ed Division or could be taught by Clemson’s SBDC, local chambers, or other providers.)

READYSC

ReadySC focuses on the training needs of new and existing business and industry in South Carolina. They provide recruiting, assessment, training development, management and implementation services to customers who are creating new jobs with competitive wages and benefits. These services are offered at minimal or no cost and training is developed to meet the specific requirements of each customer. Training may be offered through pre-employment or on the job activities dependent on the time frames and individual needs of the customers.







INCENTIVES

Anderson County offers a variety of economic incentives for the development of business and industry. The Anderson County Council generally offers incentive packages to new and existing businesses based on the investment amount, number of jobs created and average wages to be paid.

Here are some of the economic incentives offered:

PROPERTY VALUATION & ASSESSMENT RATIOS

The value of real and personal property used in manufacturing operations is established by the South Carolina Department of Revenue. Assessment ratios are applied to the fair market value of real property and vary by classification set forth by State law.

FEE IN LIEU OF PROPERTY TAXES (FILOT)

Industries investing as little as \$2.5 million in Anderson County may negotiate for a Fee-in-Lieu-of Property Taxes or FILOT which may result in savings of up to 40% of property taxes otherwise due.

SPECIAL SOURCE REVENUE BONDS (SSRB)/ INFRASTRUCTURE CREDITS

In connection with a FILOT, the county (or municipality) may issue an SSRB or provide the industry with a FILOT credit, which allows the County to generate revenue for infrastructure that enhances the economic development of a project.

MULTI-COUNTY INDUSTRIAL PARKS (MCIP)

Anderson County may enter into an agreement with an adjoining county to cause projects to be placed into a concept known as a "multi-county industrial park". This enables Anderson County to offer the SSRB/Credits referred to above and provides the industry with a \$1,000 per job jobs tax enhancement to existing job tax credits offered by the state legislation.

PROPERTY TAX ABATEMENTS (COUNTY AND MUNICIPAL)

For non-FILOT projects, new manufacturing facilities, and additions costing at least \$50,000 to existing manufacturing facilities are exempt from ordinary county taxes for a period of five years.

STATE INCENTIVES

The Job Development Credit (JDC) are available through state legislation for qualified projects creating jobs in South Carolina. Eligible companies may retain up to five (5) percent of their employee's state withholding for up to 10 - 15 years. The state legislation offers several other incentives that might be an option for an economic development project. It is best to discuss these with your Anderson County Economic Development representative for more information.

EMPLOYEE TRAINING

South Carolina's ReadySC Training Program is one of the most comprehensive and successful programs in the US. Its structure and content serve as a model for other state programs throughout the country.

Anderson County is a prime destination for international companies - from automotive suppliers such as Plastic Omnium and Bosch to Electrolux - the household appliance manufacturer.

UPSTATE INTERNATIONAL BUSINESS

To say the Upstate is recognized as the Southeastern hub for international business is an understatement. The Upstate is home to more than 240 international firms from 23 different countries. Although the Southeast as a whole is considered the hot spot for international investment in the nation, the Upstate has received global recognition. This global awareness is due to many notable companies locating either headquarter operations or large offices in the Greenville-Spartanburg-Anderson area.

According to a recent government report on foreign-owned manufacturers, foreign-owned establishments tend to be more concentrated in the Southeast. Several factors contribute to this trend, including the automotive cluster that has formed in the region following the locations of BMW in early 1992. In addition, many amenities have been added to the area to accommodate the different nationalities and their cultures - from restaurants to clubs, to the International Center of the Upstate.

INTERNATIONAL RESOURCES

The International Center of the Upstate (ICU) is a non-profit organization dedicated to promoting cross-cultural understanding among individuals, businesses and the community in the Upstate of South Carolina. The organization is focused on making international residents feel at home in the greater Upstate area. There are several clubs offering social events and educational opportunities, catering to specific nationalities and cultures. In addition, the ICU ambassador program has been created to aid companies in bringing new employees here from abroad. A bilingual volunteer is provided by the ICU to welcome the family and assist them in getting settled. The service is available for Chinese, French, German and Spanish speaking families; other languages such as Italian and Japanese are available by special arrangement.

Established in 1940, Blue Ridge is a nonprofit, customer-owned power supplier. WATER

Anderson Regional Water Association

Anderson Regional Joint Water System (ARJWA) located in Anderson, SC is a partnership of rural and municipal water districts devoted to providing a high-quality, clean, safe, reliable, economical flow of processed water to its wholesale customers. The plant's current capacity is 42.80 million gallons a day (MGD). With the latest on-going expansion project, the capacity will be taken to 48 MGD by 2009 and then to 50 MGD by 2010. The processed water is distributed to approximately 16,000 general service, industrial, and residential customers in the greater Anderson area, nine water companies, and cities of Anderson, Central, Clemson, Pendleton, Williamston, and Clemson University. www.arjwater.com

Waste Treatment

Several different entities, including the Renewable Water Resources (ReWa), Anderson County, the City of Anderson, and the Cities of Clemson and Pendleton, provide wastewater treatment services in Anderson County. ReWa operates the Piedmont plant, which serves the area along the Saluda River in the northern part of the county. Anderson County operates the Six and Twenty Treatment Plant while the City of Anderson operates the Rocky River and the Generostee plants. The Cities of Clemson and Pendleton jointly own a wastewater treatment plant on Eighteen Mile Creek. This plant serves the Clemson University-Advanced Materials Center and surrounding areas. In addition, the Cities of Belton and Williamston operate wastewater treatment facilities. There is sufficient treatment capacity to handle future growth. In 1998, the capacity of treatment plants was 18.7 mgd. with an average daily flow rate of 10.12 mgd.

Piedmont Natural Gas, Inc.

Piedmont Natural Gas Company, Inc., incorporated in 1950, is an energy and services company primarily engaged in the transportation and sale of natural gas and the sale of propane to over 920,000 residential, commercial and industrial customers in North Carolina, South Carolina and Tennessee. Piedmont has served the Anderson area since 1951. The company is the second-largest natural gas utility in the Southeast, serving more than 600,000 customers. The company and its non-utility subsidiaries and divisions are also engaged in acquiring, marketing and arranging for the transportation and storage of natural

gas for large-volume purchasers, in retailing residential and commercial gas appliances and in the sale of propane to over 48,000 customers in the company's three state area.

TRANSPORTATION

GENERAL INFORMATION

Anderson County is situated in the northwestern corner of South Carolina. Located along the I-85 corridor, otherwise known as the “Boom Belt”. The County is geographically centered between Atlanta, GA (122 miles) and Charlotte, NC (127 miles). The City of Anderson is located 113 miles from Columbia, SC and 217 miles from the port city of Charleston. From the City of Anderson, travel time is just under one hour to the Greenville-Spartanburg Airport, approximately two hours to Atlanta Hartsfield Airport and the Charlotte Douglas Airport.

MAJOR ROUTES

Interstate 85 is the backbone of the Upstate manufacturing region. Passing through the Upstate, I-85 connects the South with the

Northeast. Thirty-seven miles of I-85 frontage is located in Anderson County- more than any county in the Upstate. Anderson is only thirty minutes south of I-385- the major connector to the Port of Charleston and fifty miles south of I-26.

MOTOR FREIGHT

The Southern Connector, connects I-85 and SC 153 to I-385, and is located in Greenville and Anderson Counties. This connector shortens travel time from Anderson to both Columbia and Charleston.

- + All major eastern markets are within two days travel-time for trucking.
- + Anderson’s strategic location enables overnight trucking service to most of the Southeast.
- + Second-morning delivery to any destination on the east coast is available.
- + One-day trucking service reaches 44 percent of the country’s population and 27 percent of the nation’s manufacturing output.

RAIL

Anderson County is served by two major railroads, Norfolk-Southern and CSX, and two shortline railroads, Pickens Railroad Company and Greenville & Western Railway Company. All major metropolitan areas in the United States are accessible within three to six days by rail. The Crescent, an Amtrak passenger train, serves the area with stops in Clemson and Greenville. Due to our shortline rail partners, Anderson County is one of few areas that are capable of being dual-served adding to the flexibility and convenience of our rail service.

GREENVILLE-SPARTANBURG INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT (GSP)

The GSP terminal building has in excess of 226,000 square feet of space, second level jet bridge boarding, and thirteen departure gates. Two Federal Inspection Stations (FIS) consisting of Customs, Immigrations and Agriculture are located at GSP. The first FIS facility located under the south concourse is designed to handle 250 international passengers per hour. The second FIS location on the north cargo ramp is designed to handle cargo and corporate aircraft that require international clearance. The latest runway extension, completed in June of 1999 extends the runway to 11,001 feet making it possible for GSP to accommodate any aircraft currently in operation today. The north end of the airport is home to a 120,000 square foot FedEx facility. This facility, completed in the late summer of 2001, provides FedEx with the capability to sort up to 3,000 packages per hour. Prior to the completion of this new facility, FedEx was only capable of sorting 1,000 packages per hour. More than 1.5 million passengers per year are served by 16 airlines offering 77 non-stop daily departures to 19 major cities across the US. A connection in one of those 19 cities makes access to the world easy from GSP International.



LAKES

Lake Hartwell is located on the South Carolina / Georgia border and is one of the Southeast's largest and most popular recreational lakes.
