WHEREAS, as of November 16, 2020, the South Carolina Department of Health and Environmental Control ("DHEC") is reporting that there have been 7,129 confirmed COVID-19 cases and 198 confirmed COVID-19 deaths in the County since the pandemic began;

WHEREAS, Anderson County is currently experiencing a dramatic increase in the number of identified new COVID-19 cases, with an 7-day moving average of 72 new confirmed cases reported by DHEC at as of November 16, 2020,

WHEREAS, if COVID-19 cases continue to increase in the region, the demand for medical, pharmaceutical, personal, and general cleaning supplies may overwhelm sources of supply; the private and public sector work force may be negatively impacted by absenteeism; and the demand for medical facilities may exceed locally available resources;

WHEREAS, health authorities, including the CDC, the Surgeon General of the United States, and DHEC have made several recommendations regarding steps that each individual can take to control the spread of COVID-19;

WHEREAS, we recognize and respect the value our citizens place in the concept of individual liberty;

WHEREAS, we also recognize and respect the tremendous pain and loss that COVID-19 has caused for many families and businesses;

WHEREAS, we humbly, and respectfully, ask for the public's assistance in this time of great need.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby resolved by the Anderson County Council:

- 1) That the COVID-19 pandemic is not a hoax or a matter of small concern, but a severe and serious public health emergency that will continue to wreak havoc upon the health of our citizens and the state of our local economy so long as it continues its unabated transmission among us;
- 2) That we ask each and every one of our citizens to be respectful of the health and well-being of their neighbors, including those they may not know, by following the guidelines and best practices suggested by DHEC, such as:
- Practice social distancing by avoiding crowded gatherings and staying at least six feet from others;
- Wear a cloth mask in public;

Going to be moving on to 6(b). This will be a public hearing. Before we go into this, there's some mixed stuff in here, we've got a whole slew of things pertaining to economic development today, which I think is great news for Anderson County and our citizens, I'd just like to take a moment and for the record cheer -- make this statement: Anderson County unemployment rate dropped to 3.6 percent, almost a thousand jobs were added in October. Anderson County's unemployment situation continued to improve in October, as the region continues to recover from the COVID-19 disruption. The unemployment rate to 3.6 from 4.3 in September, the total number of employed persons increased to 90,377. That's an increase of 975 people. Labor force also expanded, going from

93,386 to 93,759. The number of unemployed dropped from 3,984 to 3,382. In October of 2019 the county's unemployment rate was 2.3 with 90,082 people employed.

I think this is great news, showing the right direction. And as we said, there's more of these to come. I know people are hurting, especially in other parts of the country, but Anderson, so far at this point, our economic outlook has been very blessed.

I just want to make a comment that our government affairs Steve Newton made: Seeing this increase in both labor force and employment, accompanied by a decrease in unemployment, are the kind of indicators we need to see right now. Hopefully we can continue these trends through the holiday season and get 2021 off to a positive start. Comments from Mr. Newton. We appreciate that.

And that'll lead us into 6(b), 2020-025, an ordinance authorizing, (1) pursuant to Chapter 44 of Title 12, South Carolina Code of Laws, 1976, as amended, the execution and delivery of a fee agreement by and between Anderson County, South Carolina and BMW Manufacturing Co., LLC; and (2) other matters related there.

This will be a public hearing. But before we go into the public hearing, I want to ask Mr. Nelson if he will say a few words so if somebody wants to talk they'll know what they're talking about.

BURRISS NELSON: Thank you, Mr. Chairman, members of council. This, of course, is the BMW county-wide and really state-wide fee in lieu agreement that captures all of their tools that go to our first, second and third tier auto suppliers in Anderson County. So not that it's a direct investment in any one of those companies, but it does provide capital investment that is taxable and goes into those entities, but allows them to be profitable and to run and to hire the citizens of Anderson County.

It's a great opportunity for us that BMW came and provides investment all over the entire state.

But I would like to echo what Reverend Emmanuel said just a minute ago, that we've been blessed and we've had fabulous leadership from Anderson County Council that allows us to have a thousand jobs back in the economy in one month. That's been an amazing thing. But thank you, sir. Thank you, members of council.

And also I like the thing of doing some private roads. I think that's going to help us two-fold. One, the county not having to put it in the system, and two, making a little bit more -- develop it easier and making it better for our citizens to get a nice chunk of land maybe a little bit more affordable. Anyone else? Ms. Wilson and Mr. Sanders were at the meeting. Got any comments?

CINDY WILSON: May I, Mr. Chairman? TOMMY DUNN: Yes, ma'am. CINDY WILSON: Putting this into

another facet or context here, Greenville County has

begun to or may have already implemented some pretty stringent development standards in their county. I had a real estate broker to inform me recently that there's hardly any land left in Greenville County to develop; therefore, they're coming to Anderson County. And when I say they, those are primarily out of state developers. It's so important that we encourage good quality development, because most of us will still be here for a while. And we have our children and grandchildren to think of in future generations.

And if we allow trashy development in the county, that becomes a burden, and especially in the case of School District 1. They have I don't know how many, two or three thousand, houses that have yet to be built. Twelve hundred lots that have been permitted and recorded that haven't been built on yet, of that number. But yet the school district is totally —they're bonded out. They're constrained by Act 388. They can't go back to the public, even with the two percent sales tax. Their projections for increased population that they have to care for in the schools woefully under-predicted what they're having to come up with.

You also have the issues of the fire departments. They're volunteer fire departments. Infrastructure. We could go on. And plus the quality of life. So it's very incumbent on us now to all work together to put measures in place that encourage good quality. It's not so much the size of the house, but the type of neighborhood in the context of the community, and a lot of other factors. Thank you.

TOMMY DUNN: Thank you. Anyone

else?

They have written their peace. That's what is liberty in the United States. It's not tearing down stuff. It's not rioting. It's not burning. It's not trying to take sides, one side against the other. It's everybody working together to make the environment better.

And in saying that, I hope that there will be some people who maybe read the minutes of the meeting that are not here that will take this to heart and maybe, Ms. Wilson, you can kind of bring it up again, the fact that this is the way we need to do things and not through rebellion and whatever else is going on.

I'm very concerned for our nation. The election results are nothing but a hoax. Everybody knows it now. The whole thing has been reconfigured by other countries with the dominion and the other software that changed the votes ---

49 50 growing up, that if they could see monuments and statues in context and have an opportunity to read and to ask questions, that may go a long ways toward creating an even better community. And that would certainly be my hope and prayer. Thank you. Everybody have a good Thanksgiving.

Thank you. TOMMY DUNN: Mr. Wooten? CRAIG WOOTEN: Yes, just two quick comments. I know that Zoom or videoconferencing only lasts sixty-one days for the county council meeting. I understand that. I do think it would be interesting moving forward in the future, since our committee meetings are only three council members and ultimately a recommendation and not a full vote, that committee meetings could be video conferences in the future, because I think that would be -- those are sometimes in the middle of the day or early in the morning, and it would be easier for people, especially council members who live on different corners of the county.

The last thing I was going to point out, and this is just an idea. This might could be talked about after I'm gone, but I noted Mr. Burriss Nelson talked about with the Asbury Park development, there's a tax incentive within -- you know, the county is going to receive three percent of gross sales. And I think we could do some interesting things with that because right now it's going into the general fund, but I could imagine a time when a company comes and we give them a twenty year tax incentive and three percent goes into a recreational capital fund or part of the money could go into a firefighter capital fund if that development deems new trucks that could reach better the capacity of that plant. So it seems like there could be some things that could be done there that could be creative and could benefit the different districts. That's all.

TOMMY DUNN: Thank you, Mr. Wooten.

Mr. Graham?

RAY GRAHAM: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. That is a good point on the committee meetings. That would be something great to maybe possibly pursue. And also, I mean I assume that what we done today would cover committee meetings, as well; correct?

RUSTY BURNS: Yes, sir.

RAY GRAHAM: So I know that would

probably benefit us on that.

The only thing I've really got, just wanted to again mention the unemployment. It's -- I know I'm proud of our county to look at what we've been through

in 2020 and to basically realize that we're, what, one percent above what we were this time last year on unemployment rate. That is — when you look at what our nation has went through and what our county has went through, that's just absolutely tremendous. We've still got a lot of factors that lies ahead with this COVID, but it's great to see the people in our county are able to work and provide for their families. So definitely good to see that. And other than that, glad to be here today, Mr. Chairman. Thank you.

TOMMY DUNN: Thank you, Mr. Graham.

Mr. Sanders?

BRENT SANDERS: I'd just like to wish everyone a safe and blessed Thanksgiving. Thank you, sir.

TOMMY DUNN: Thank you, Mr. Sanders. I'd just like to echo Mr. Graham's comments about the committees. I think that is a good idea and would thank Mr. Wooten for bringing that up. I think that would help out during the day when we have to have some of these committee meetings. Would greatly help out. And we can do that under this ordinance. And we might be able to do something to make that permanent.

Also along Mr. Wooten's lines about the money and all. Correct me if I'm wrong, Mr. Burns, but Mr. Davis up in District 6 worked out something with a company up there where they're going to donate so much money to the fire department ---

RUSTY BURNS: That's right.

TOMMY DUNN: --- that's covering them up there. So we've talked about that, and I would like to see any future companies coming in, fee in lieu agreements, they should be captured to where they have to give to that -- should go to the fire department instead of the fire commission, what I'm trying to say. The people that's on the front lines that needs the money, that's who needs the money is the ones having to protect that district, that building, that industry, that company, instead of 2 (unintelligible) Road, in my opinion.

And I would want to thank all of our council members for coming to these meetings during this pandemic and getting through these things. I know it's an inconvenience at twelve o'clock and at the Civic Center sometimes, but I want to appreciate council for doing this, getting us through this, and conducting the people's -- the business for the citizens of Anderson County. And I think it's very important in these economic development times to keep

moving and keep striving forward.

I want to really appreciate Mr. Nelson, Mr. Burns,
and their staff for helping us get through these
economic development things and pursuing them.
