During this meeting, CJCC staff will present an overview of criminal justice system metrics, including detention center classification and detention center recidivism. This data will continue to inform the development of the framework through which CJCC leadership will establish countywide, multi-agency goals for improving the local criminal justice system's efficiency and effectiveness.

Additionally, during this meeting, CJCC leadership with make membership recommendations to the following committees: Pre-Trial Risk Assessment, Mental Health Court, Crisis Stabilization Unit, Case Processing Review Board, Community Mapping, Community Engagement and Centralized Database.
