Criminal Justice Coordinating Council (CJCC) Announces December Meeting

ANDERSON, SC – The Criminal Justice Coordinating Council (CJCC) of Anderson County will hold its regularly scheduled monthly meeting on Monday, December 3, 2018 at 4:00 p.m. at the Anderson County Main Library, 300 North McDuffie Street, Anderson, SC.

During this meeting, the CJCC Executive Committee will present an overview of detention center recidivism by charge for 2017 and Pre-Trial Risk Assessment Tool validation results. This data will continue to inform the development of the framework through which CJCC leadership will establish countywide, multi-agency goals for improving the local criminal justice system's efficiency and effectiveness.

Additionally, during this meeting, the CJCC Executive Committee will appoint Chairs to the following committees: Pre-Trial Risk Assessment, Mental Health/Veteran's Court, Crisis Stabilization Unit, Detention Center Population Review Board, Community Mapping, and Community Engagement. Committees will have time allotted during this meeting to "meet and greet," as well as discuss tentative goals/strategies.
