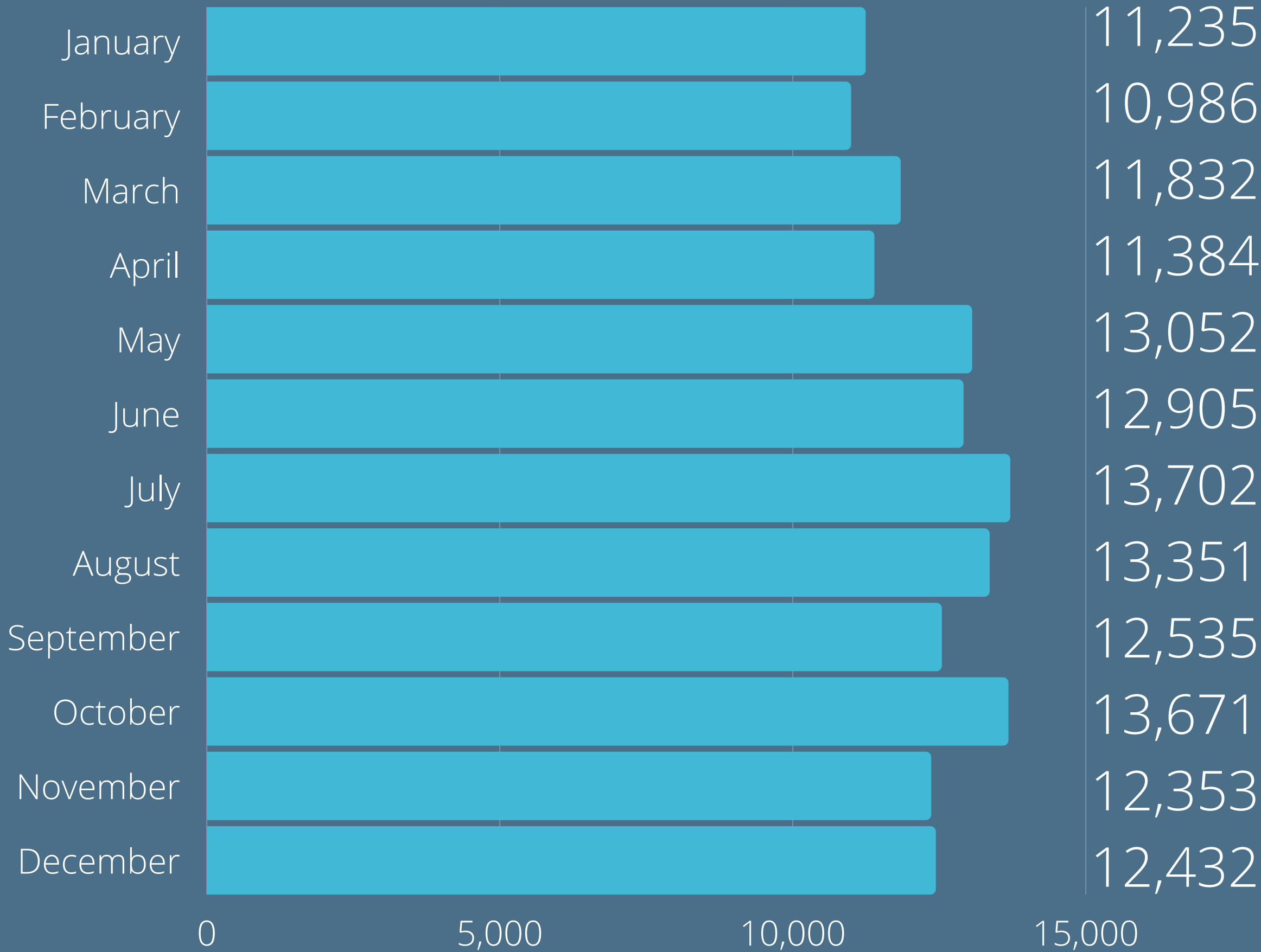

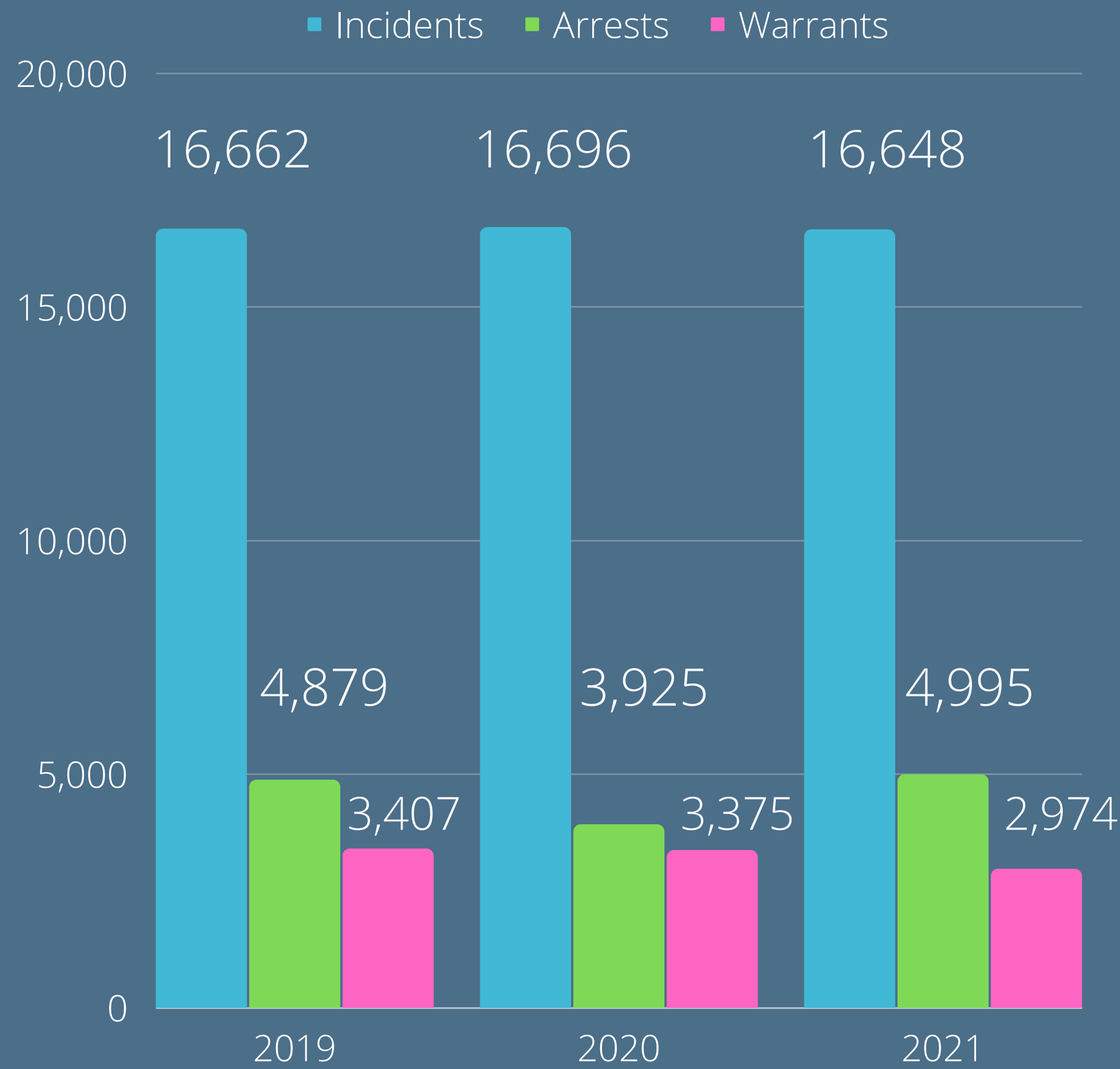

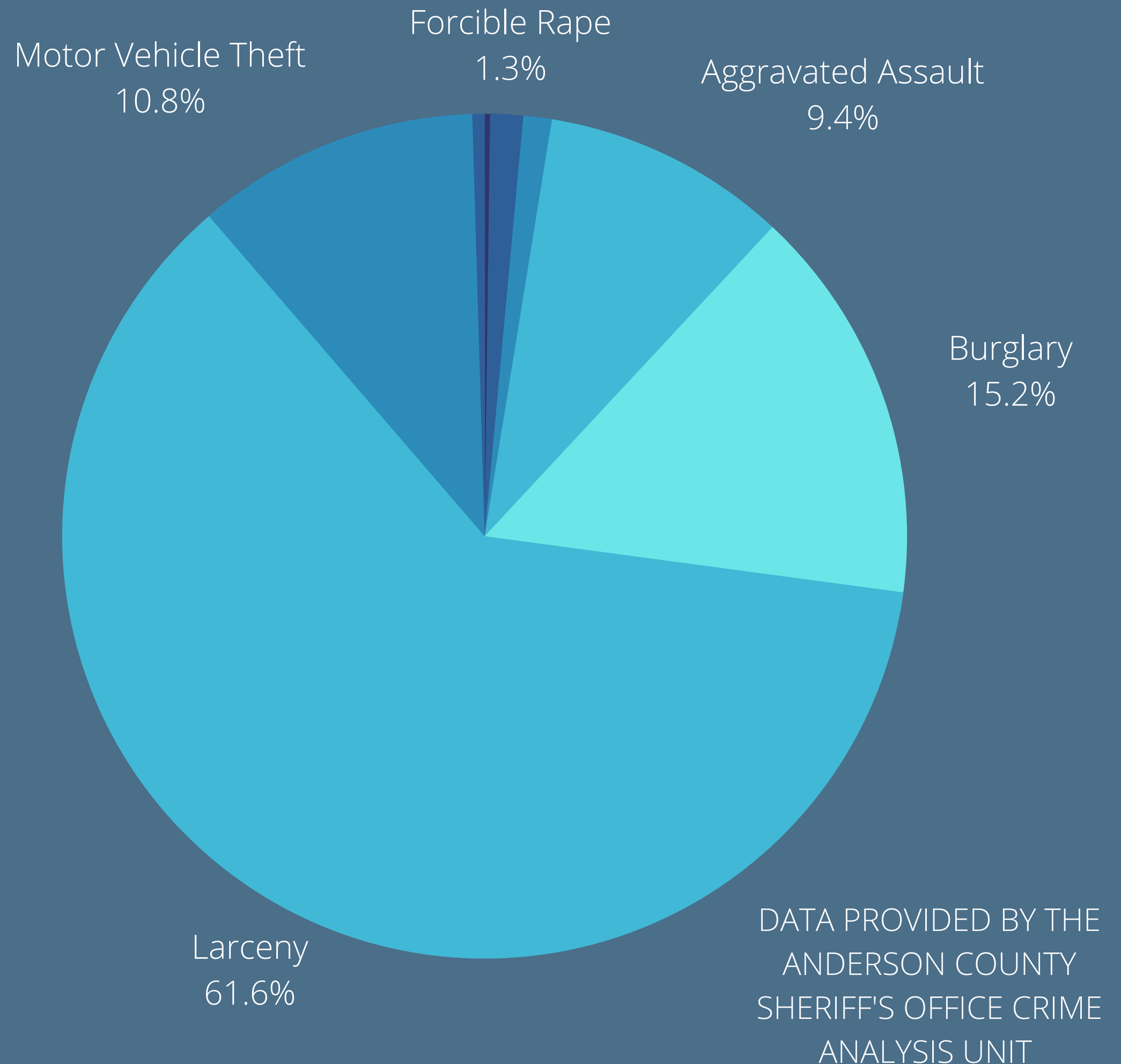

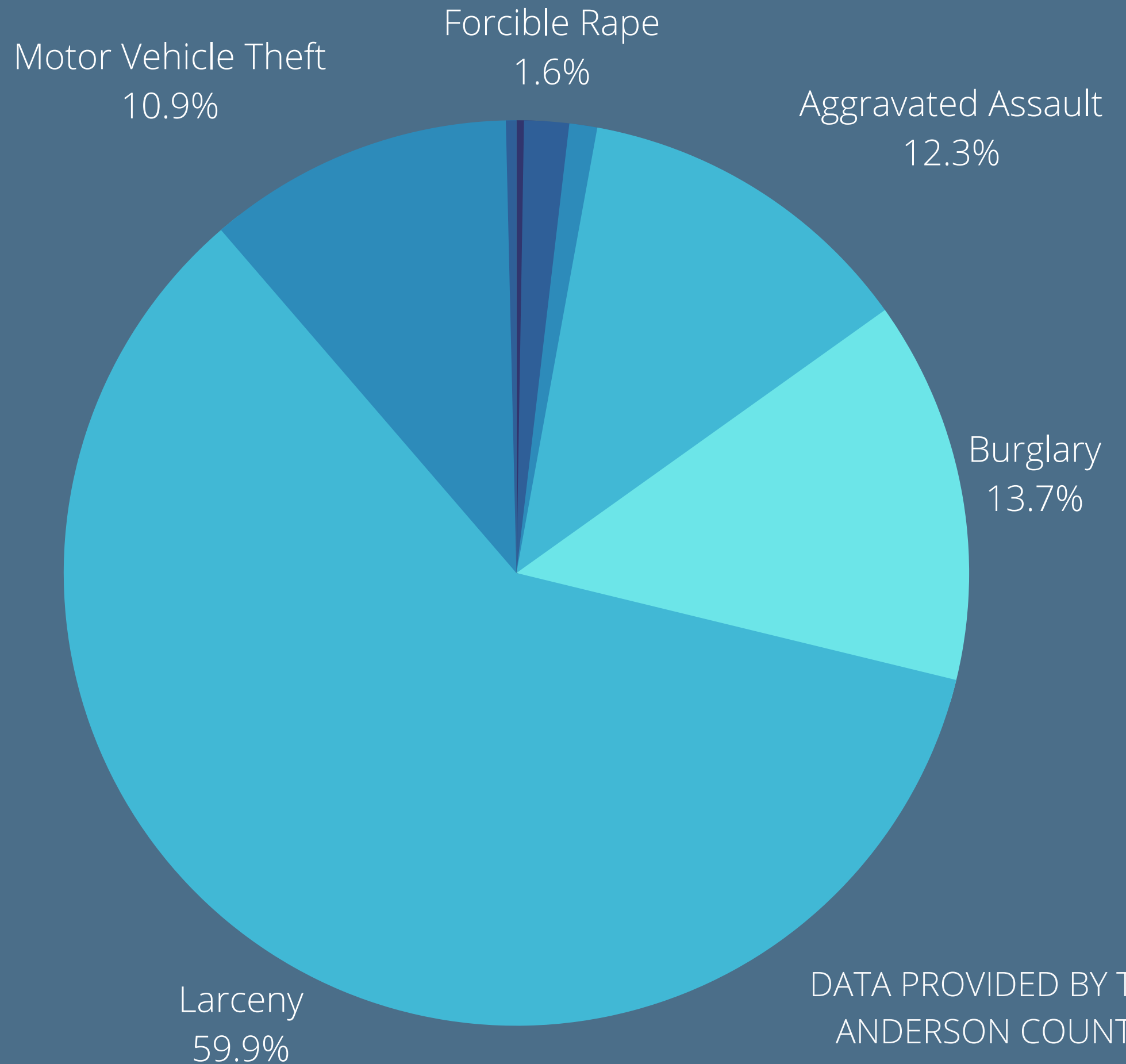

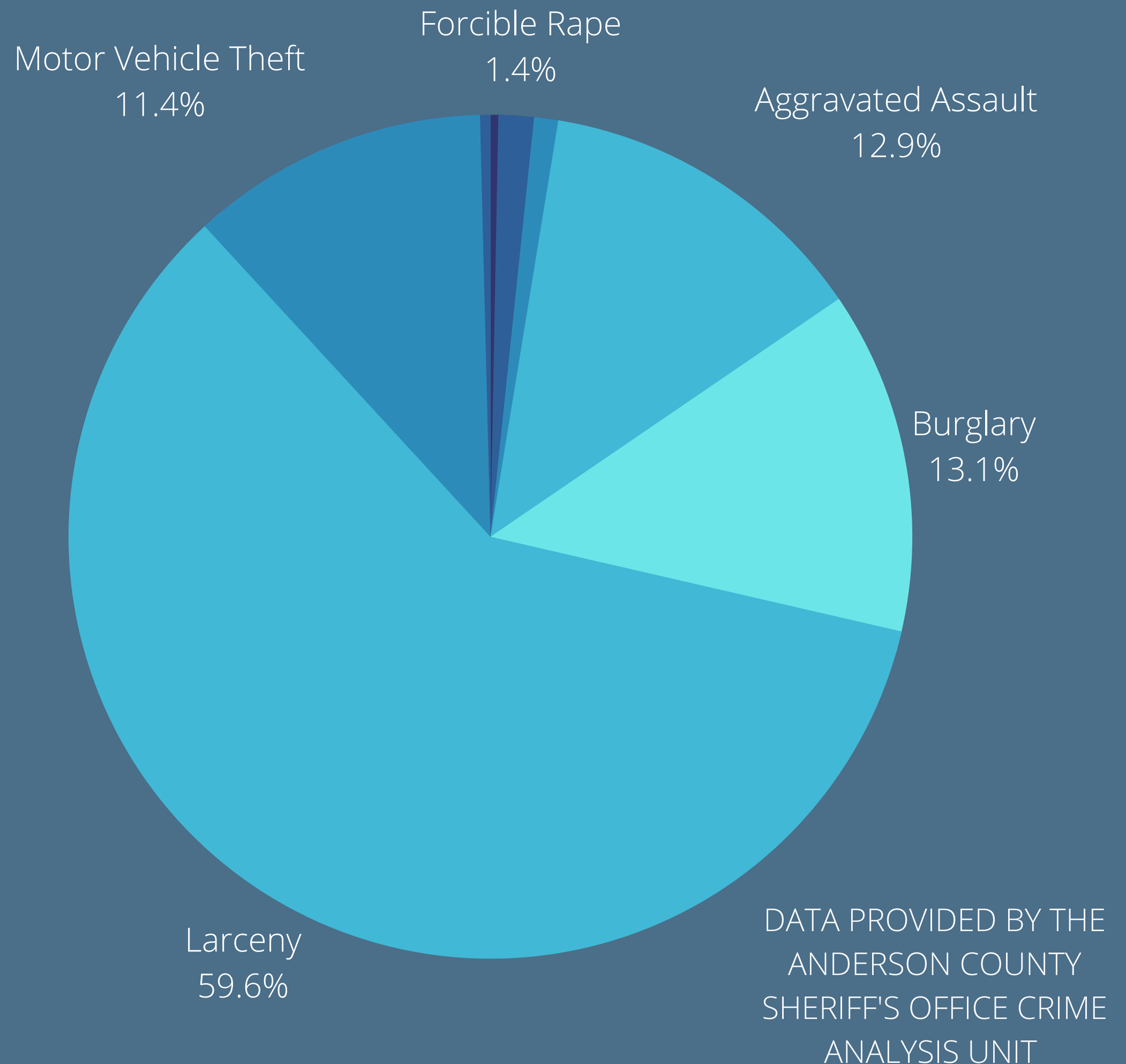

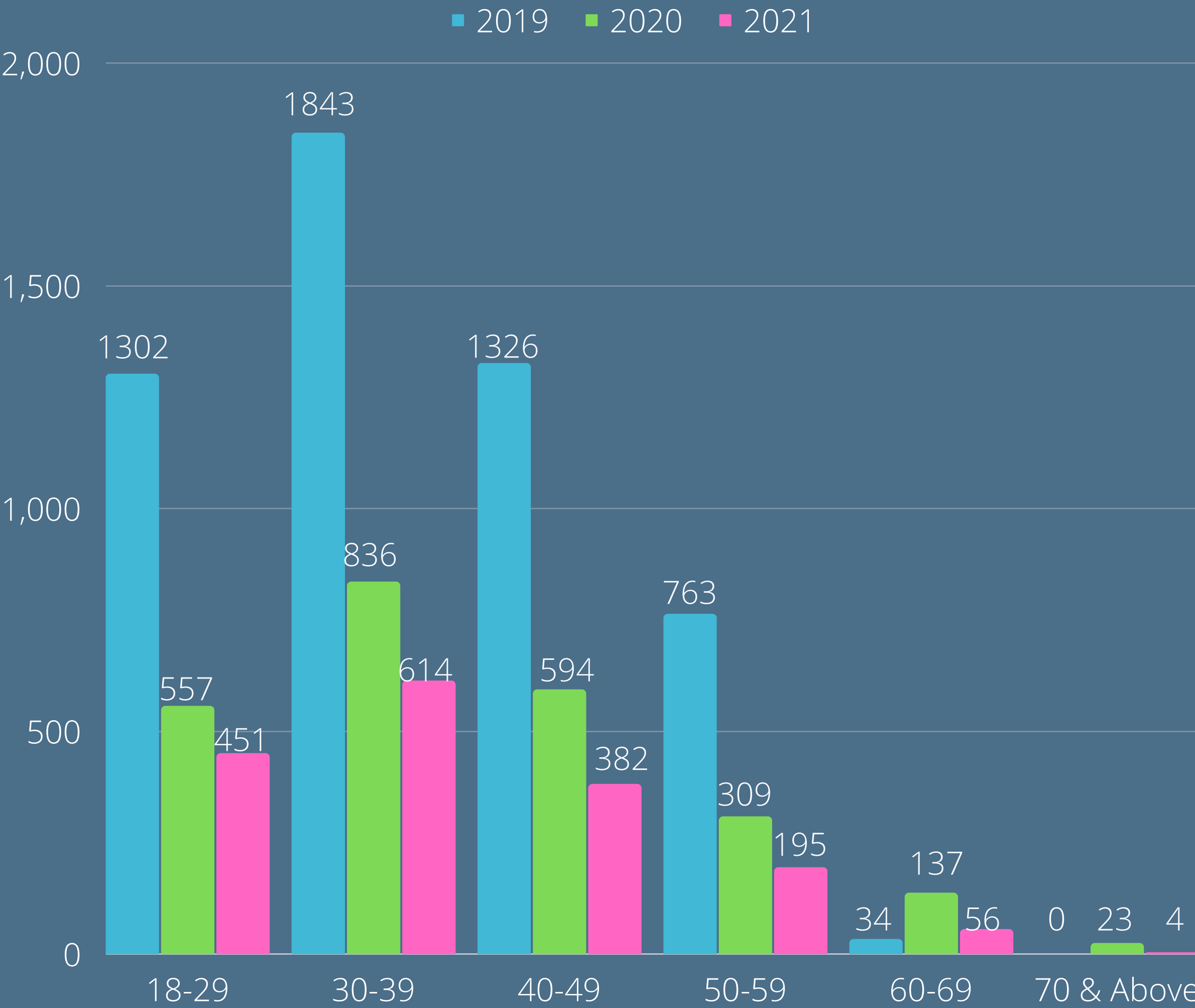


Anderson County Detention Center Bookings

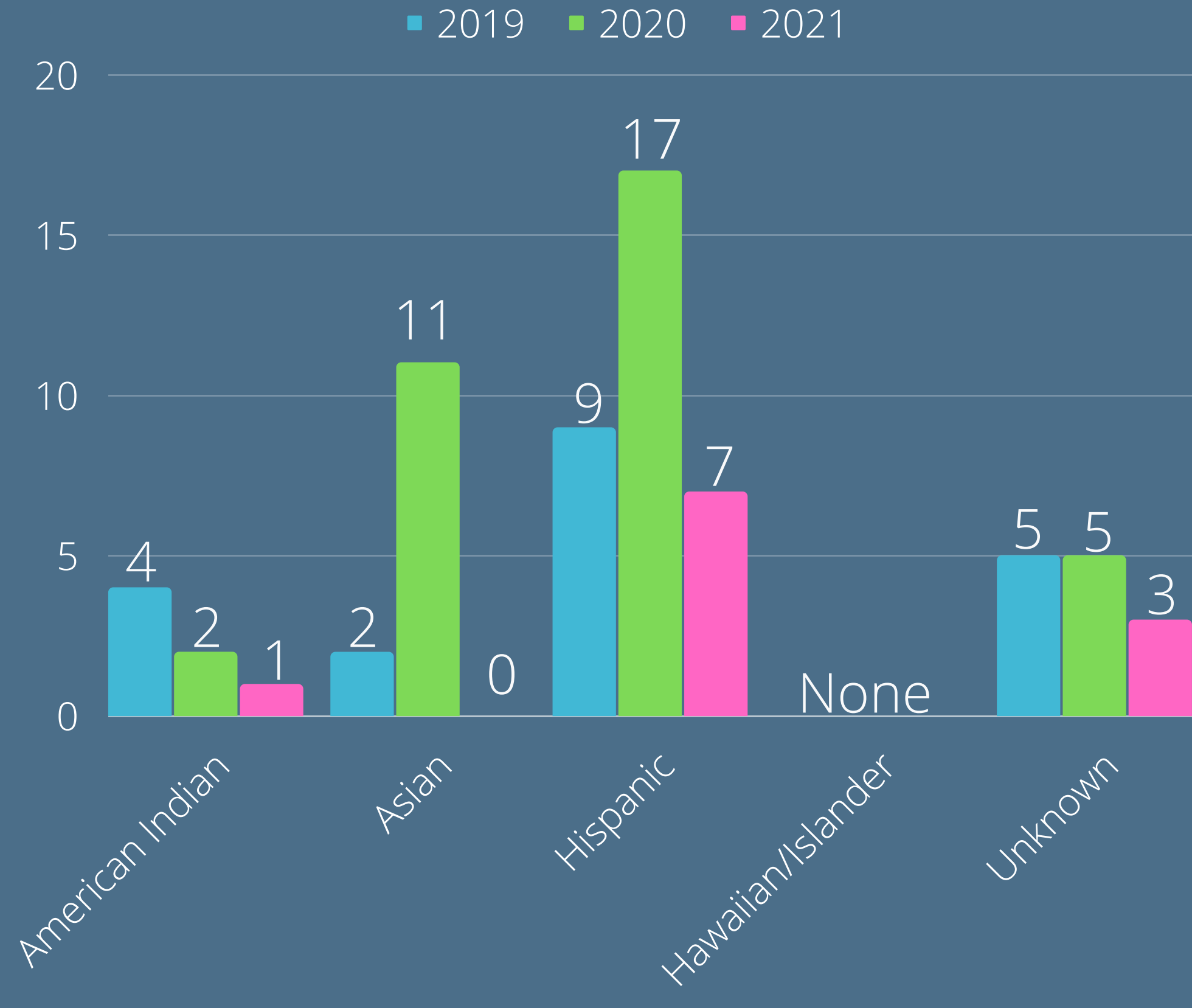
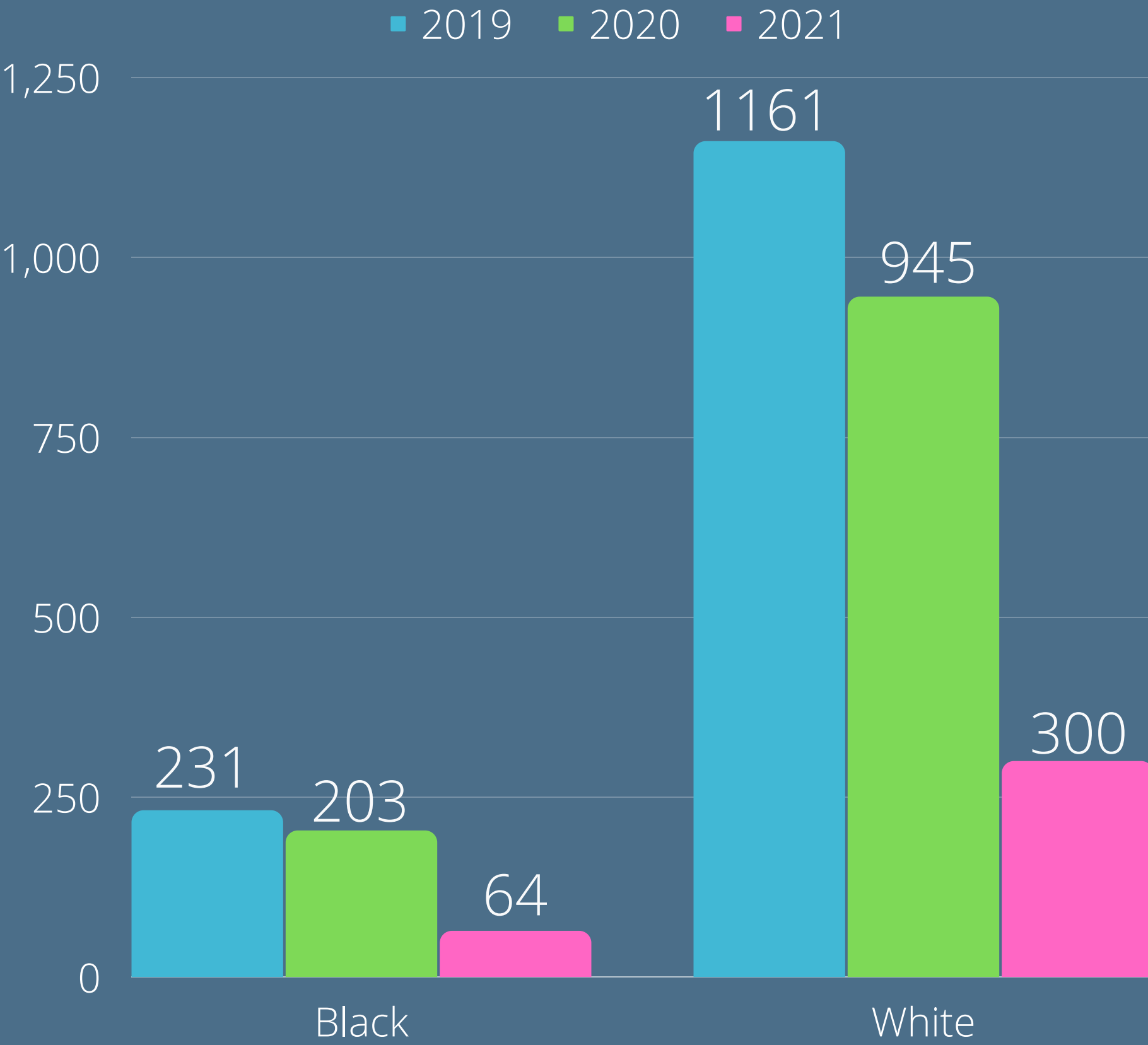
Ages of Booked Inmates

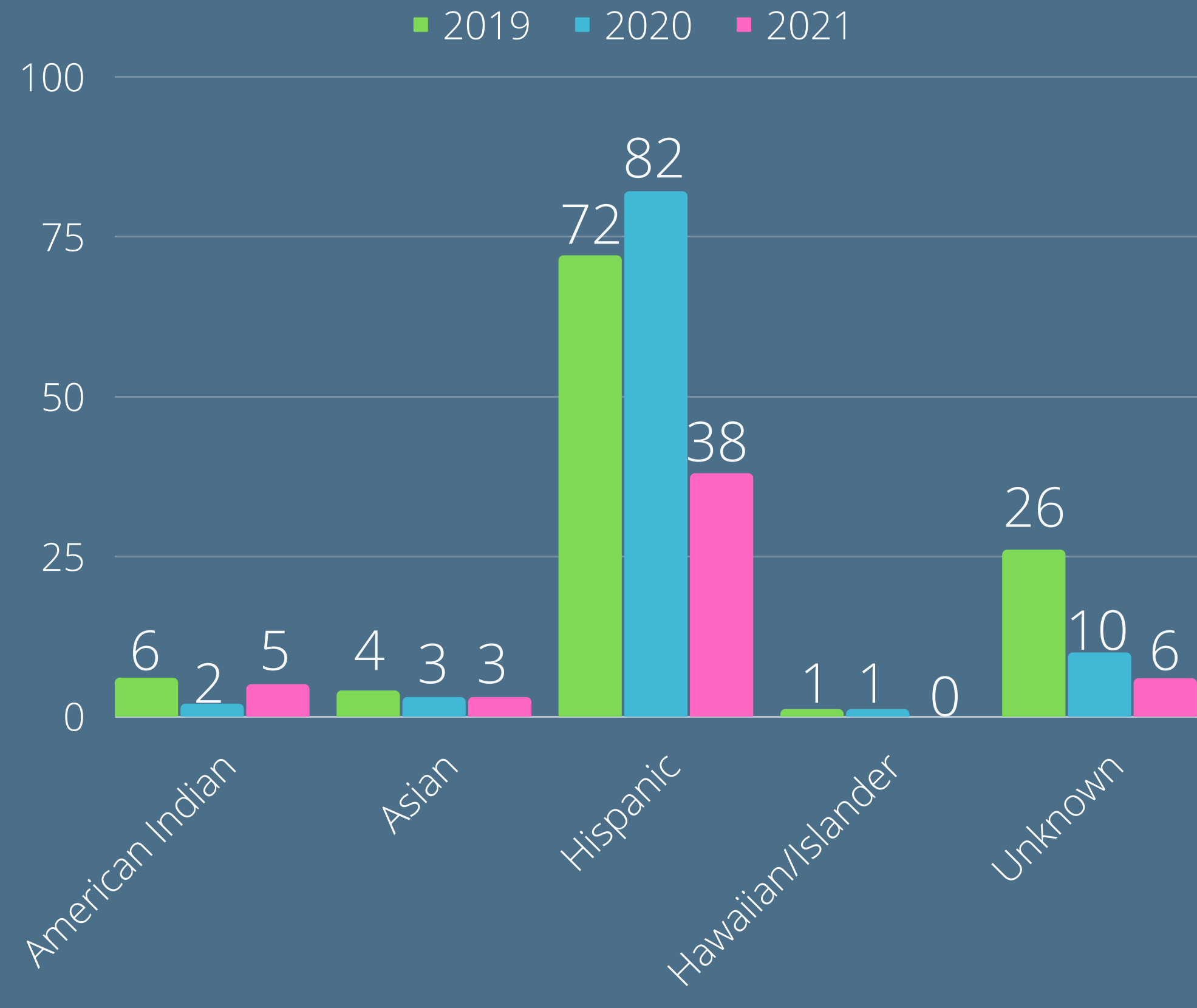
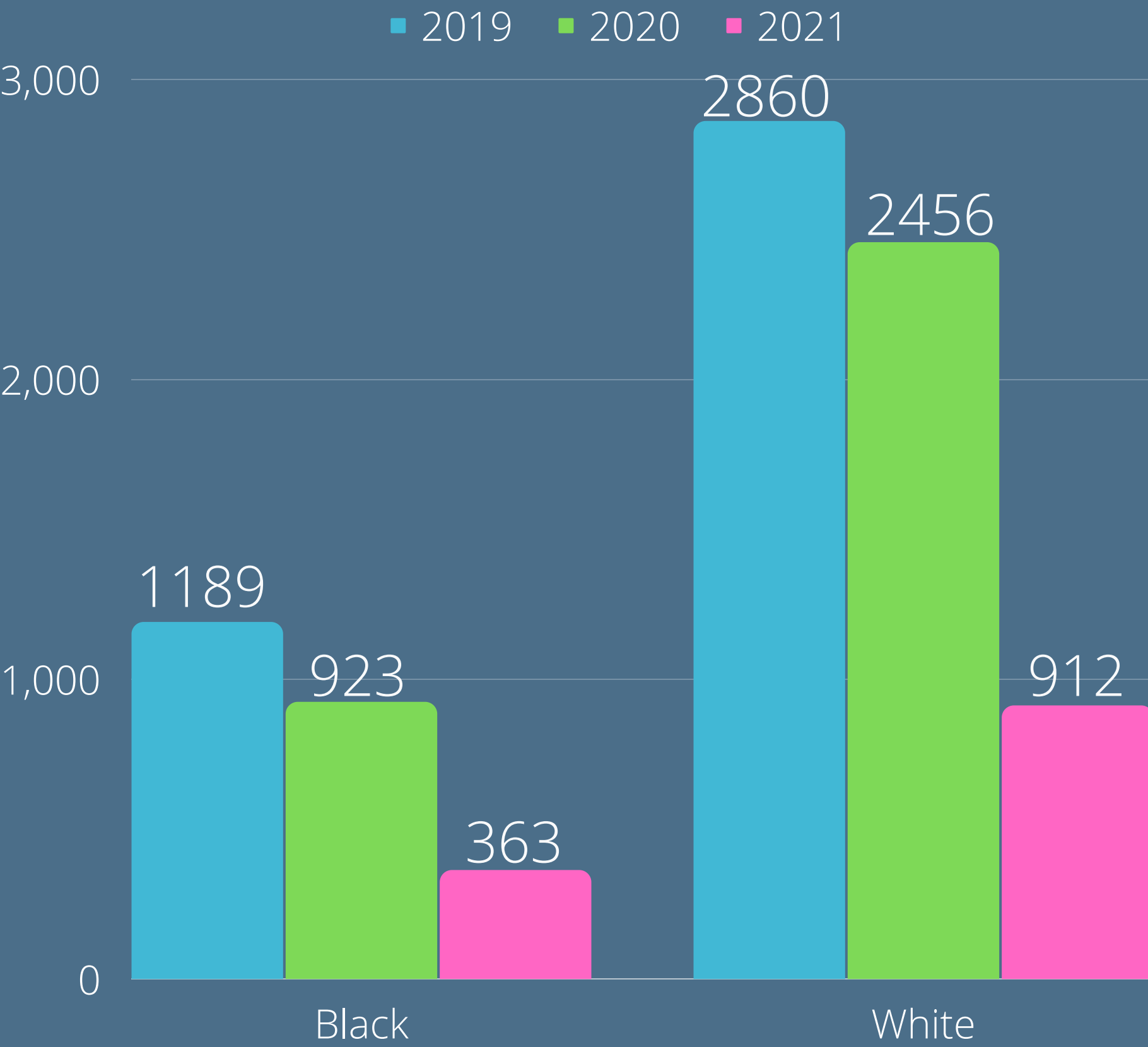
Race: Females

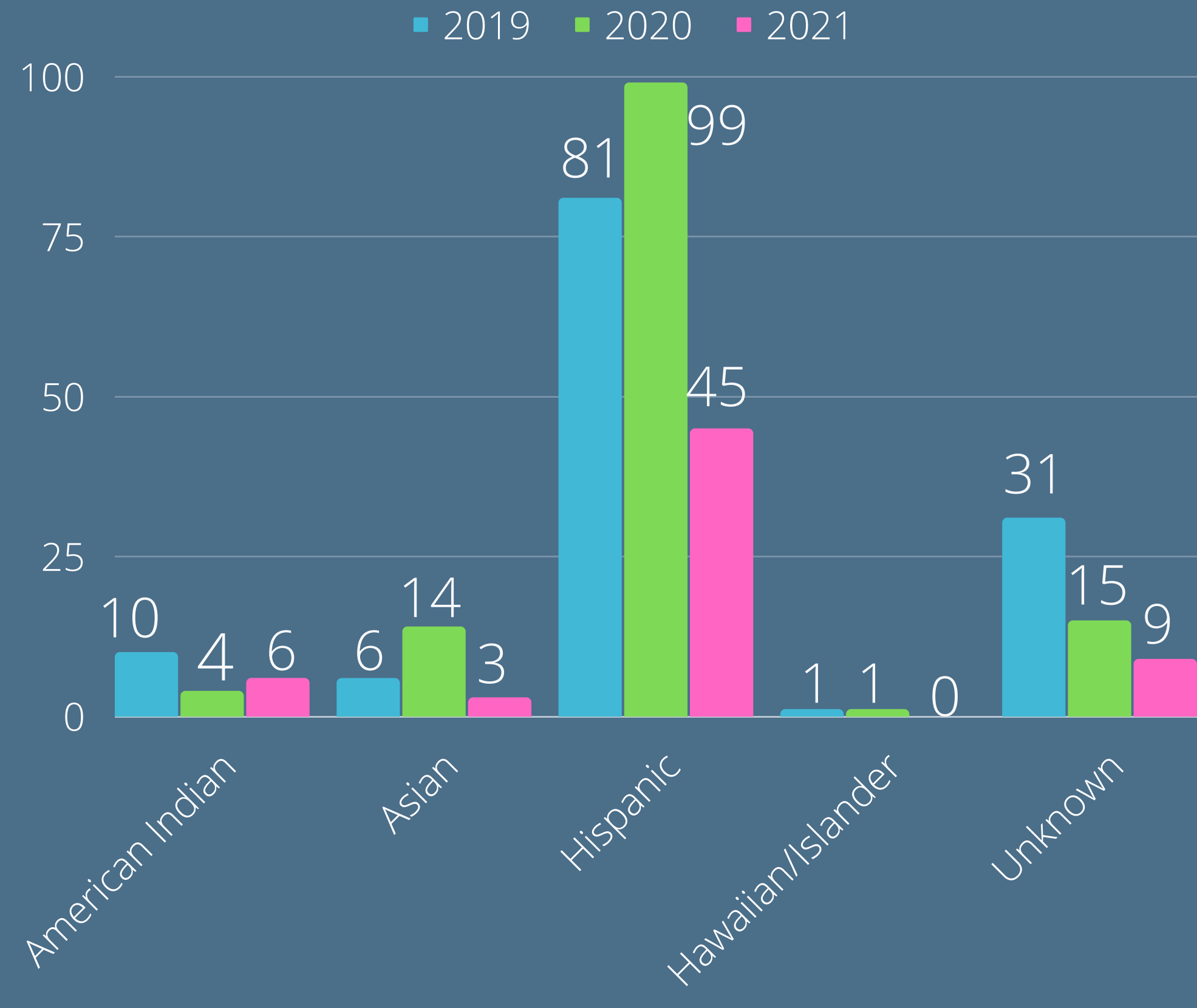
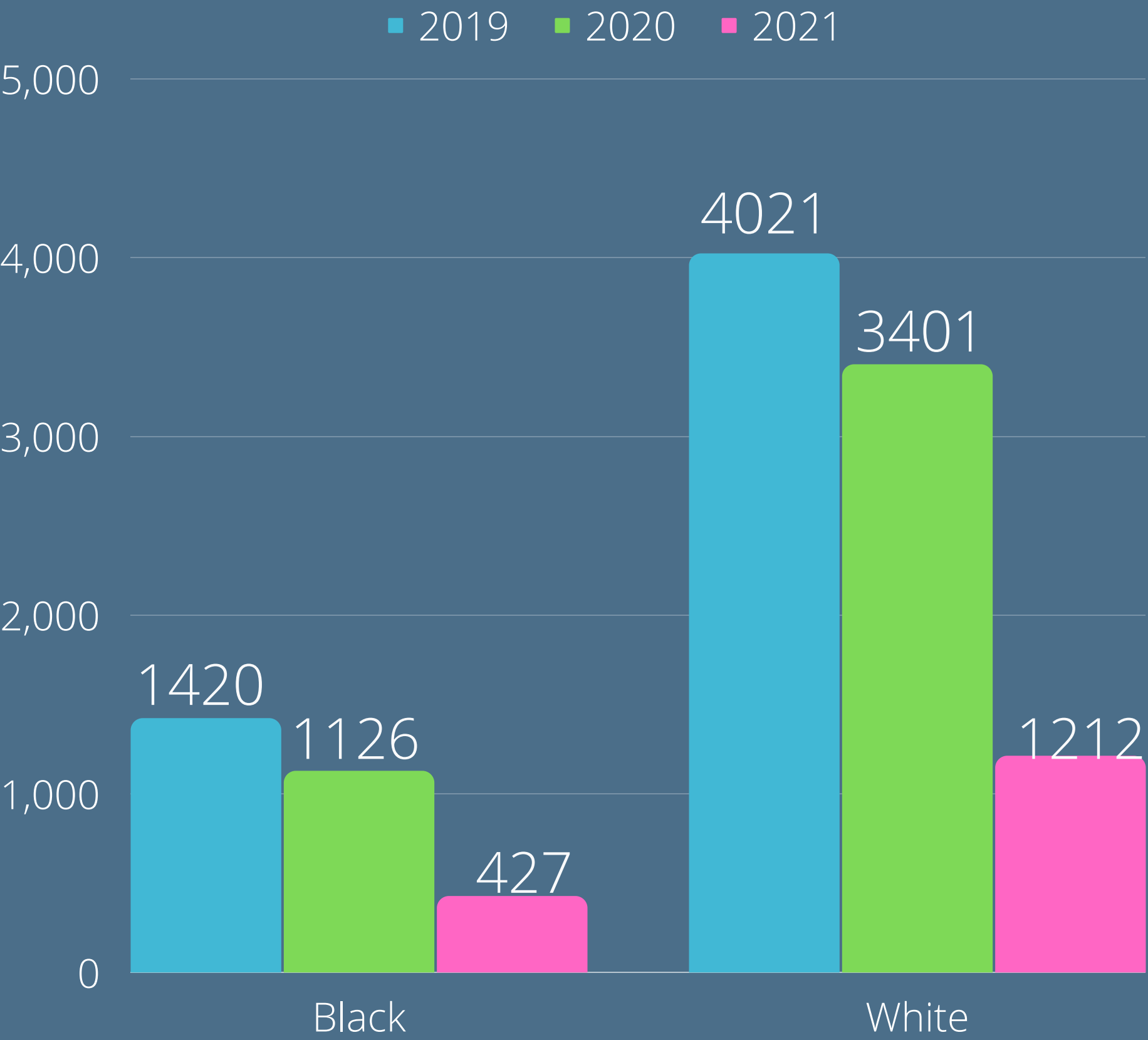
Race: Males

Race: Total

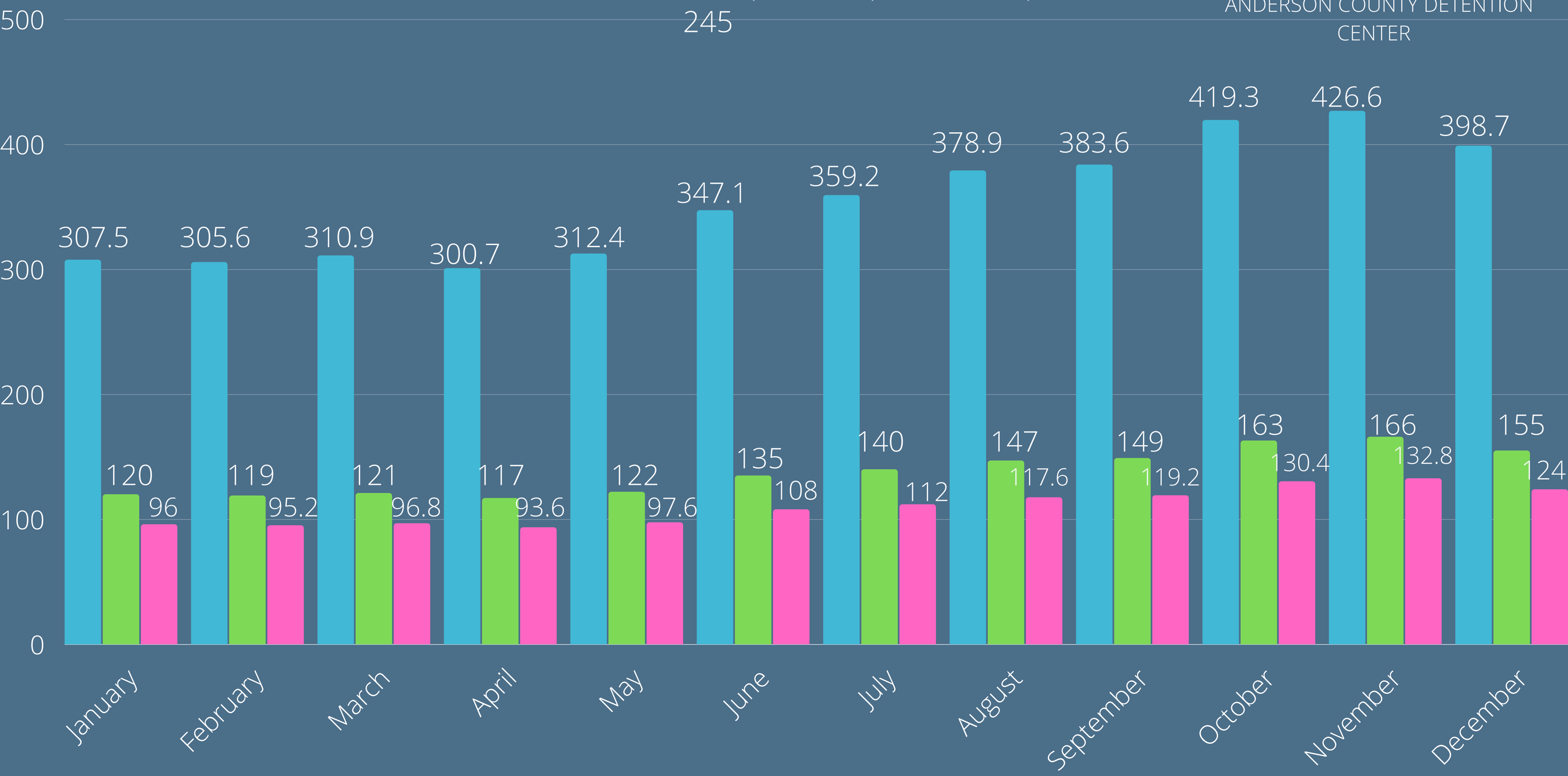

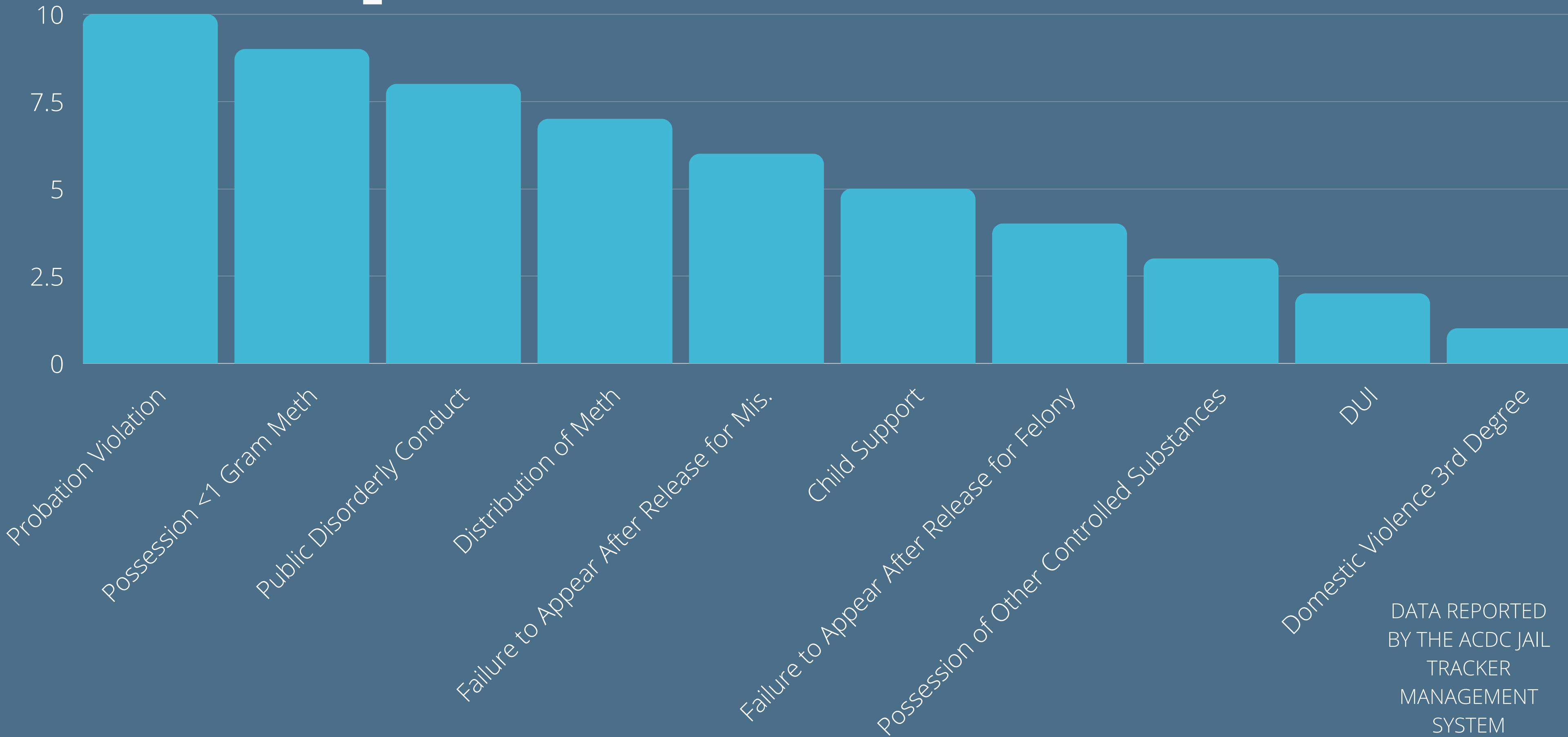

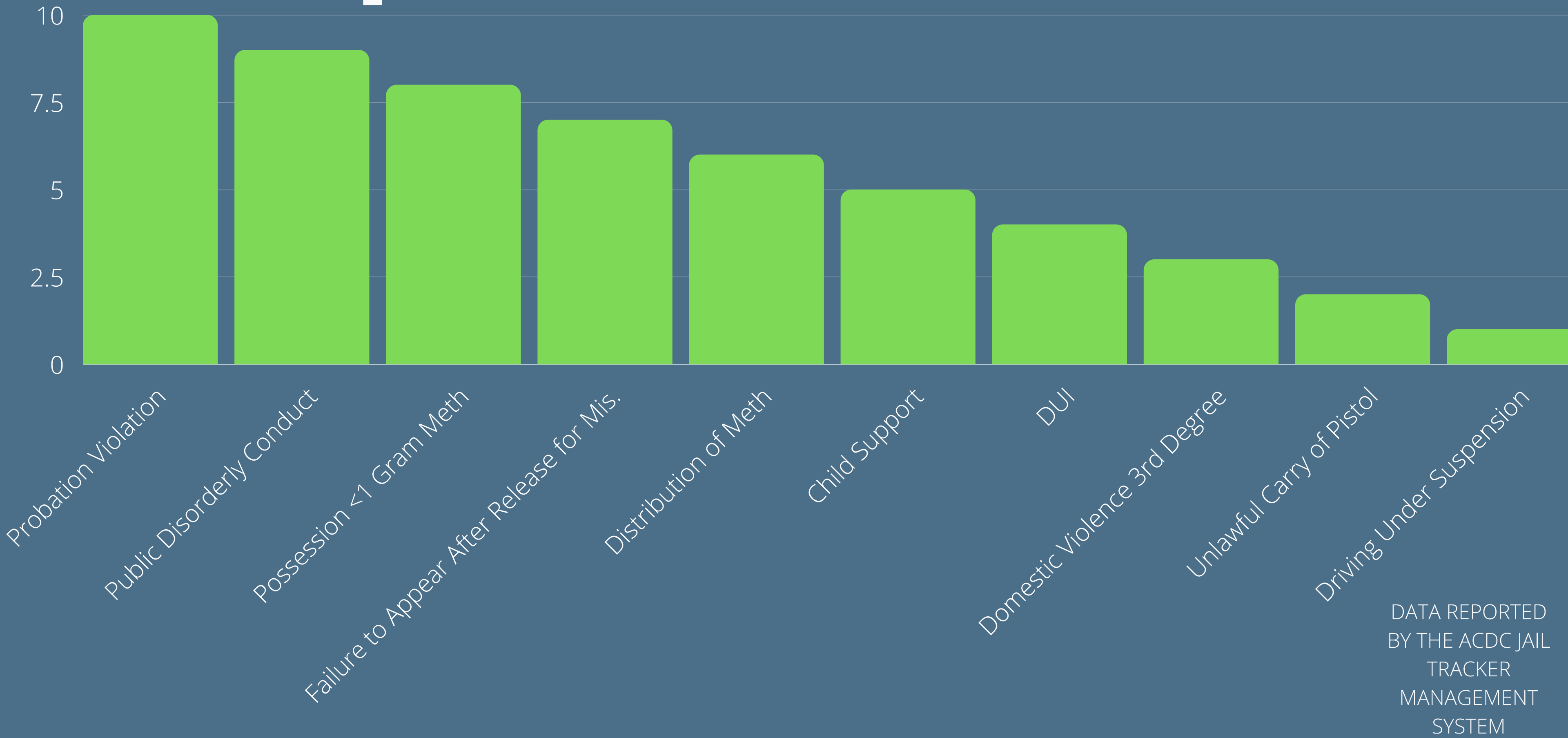

Top 10 Offenses: 2019



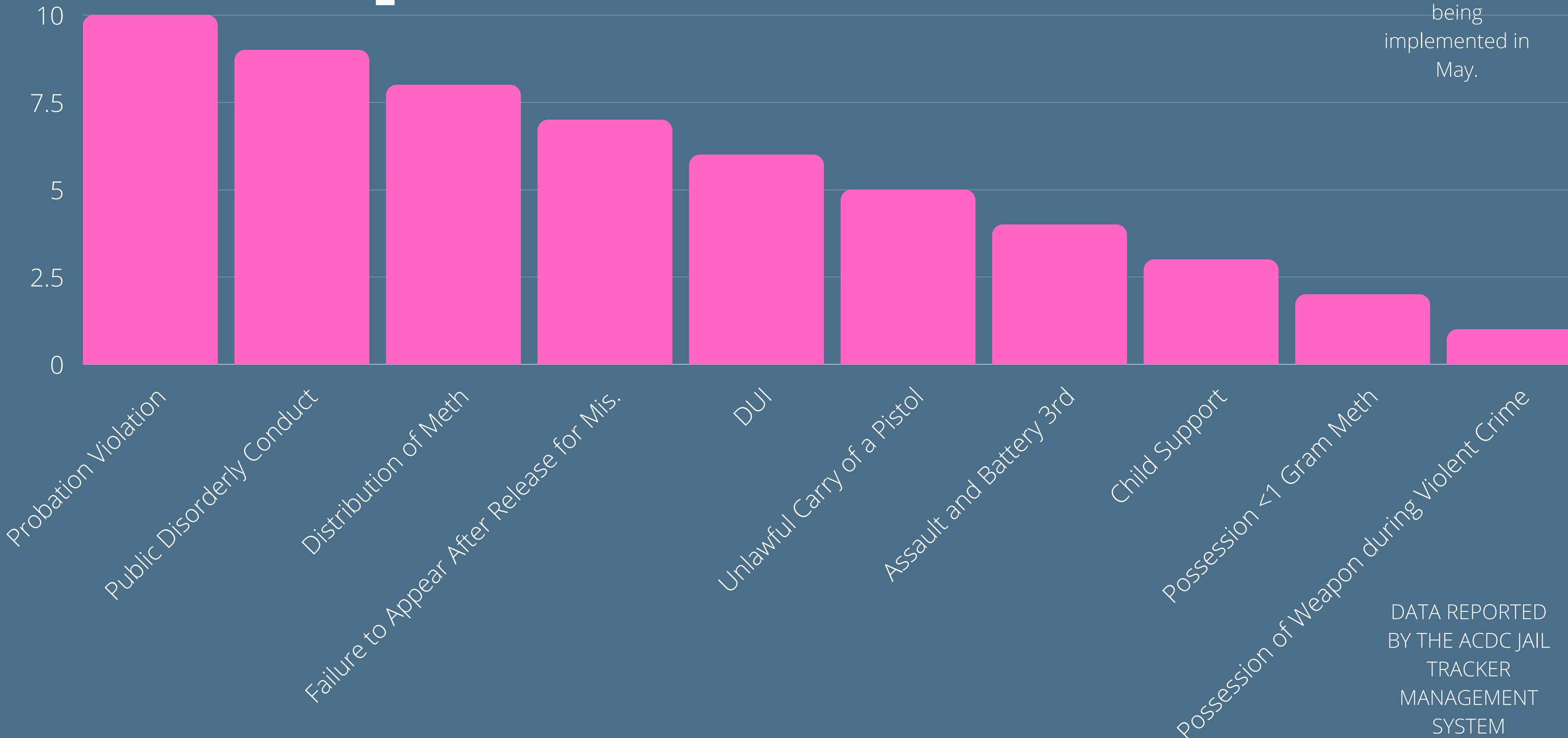

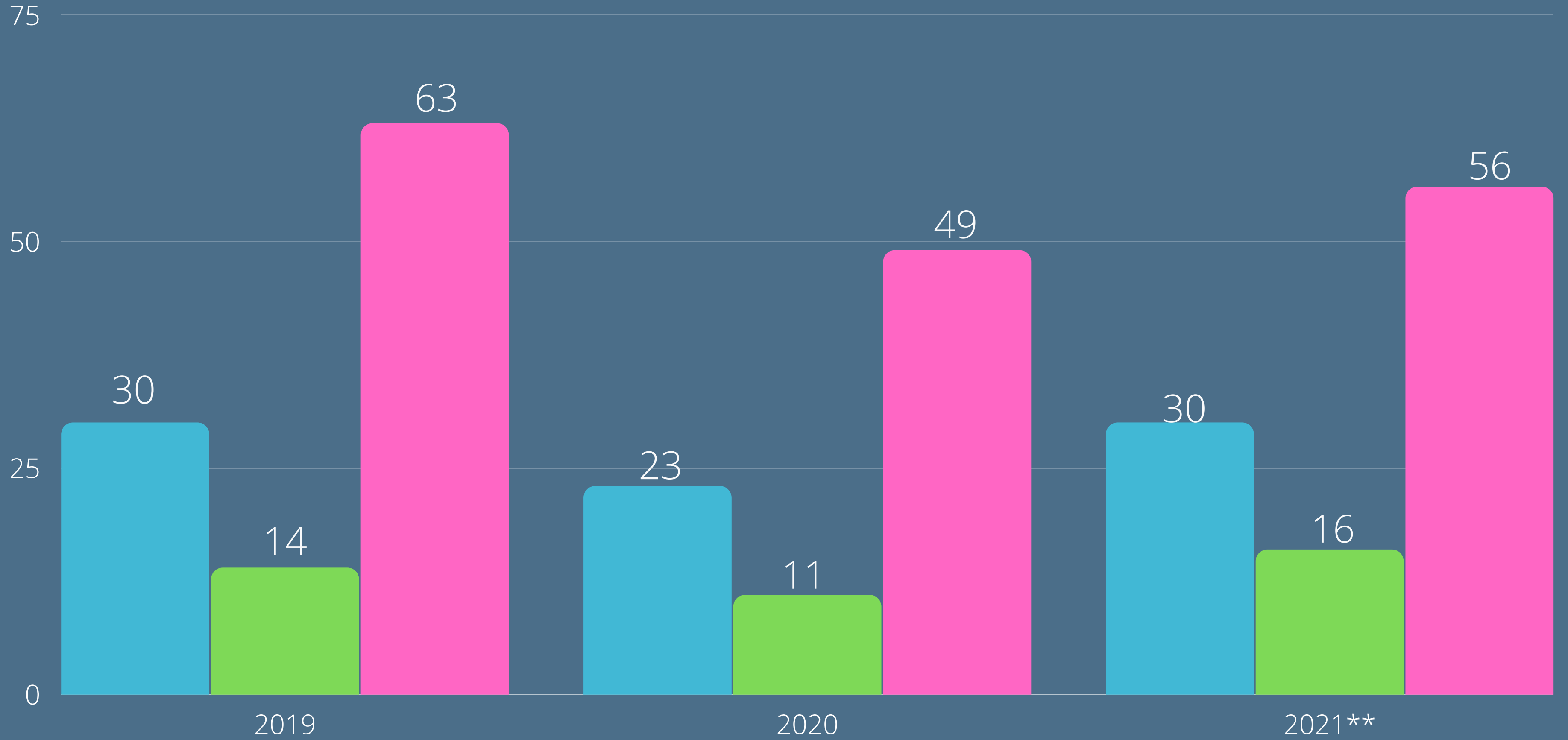

Average Length of Stay

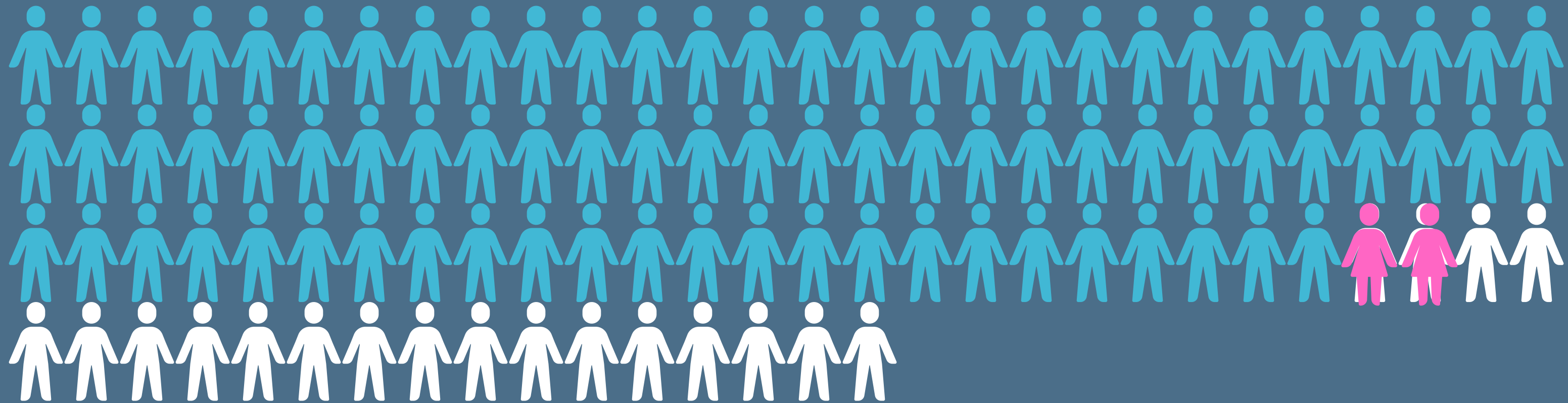

Overall ALOS: Misdemeanor ALOS: Felony



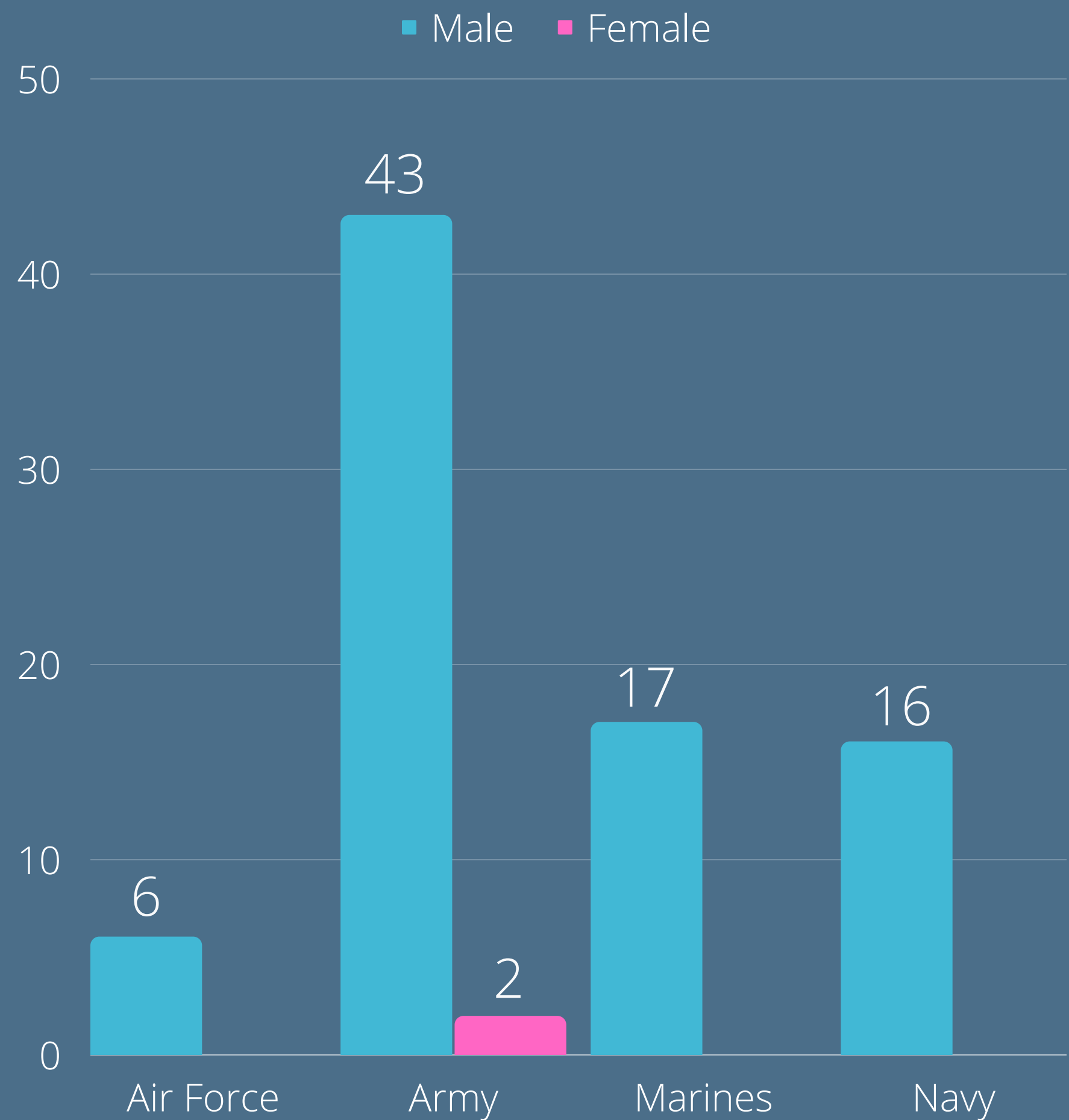
Military Service Report

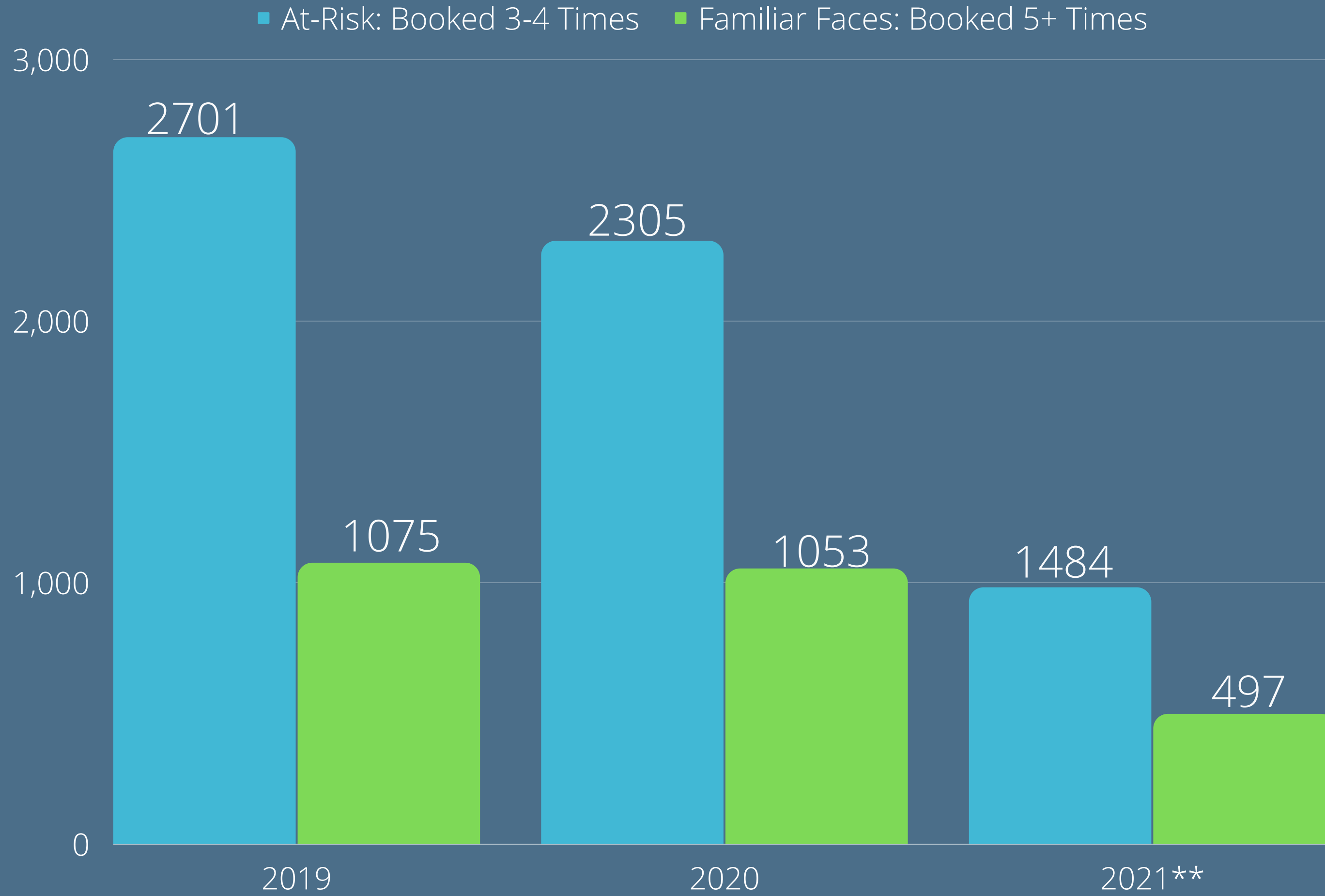

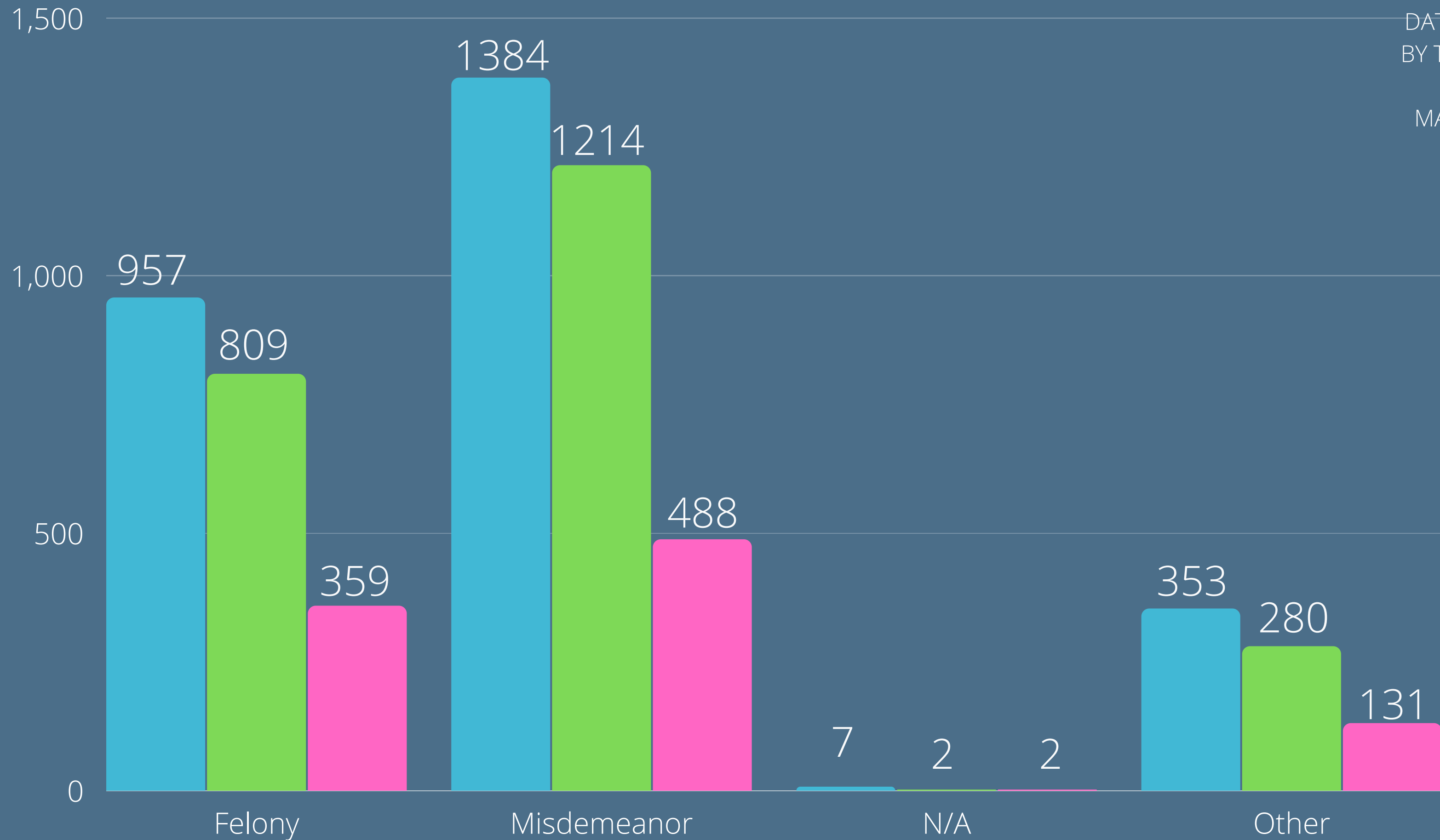

Status of Mental Health Screenings in ACDC

Since the implementation on January 15, 2019, Universal Mental Health Screenings occur with every booking in the Anderson County Detention Center. The medical staff utilize the information for the inmates not released to coordinate care with the in-house doctor and/or local mental health facility. The Detention Center has a Mental Health Liaison assigned to the facility and we utilize TeleHealth (remote mental health sessions as needed).
