- Motion to Approve: Minutes as presented. (All) (Approved)
- Pre-Trial Risk Assessment Update:
  - Motion from Pre-Trial Risk Assessment Committee: To dissolve into Detention Center Population Review Board. (Approve)
  - Jennifer Johnson/Casey Collins to coordinate with City of Anderson to complete Indigent Screenings/Pre-Trial Risk Assessment for bond setting.
  - Ticket and Release Program to begin March 11, 2019. Casey Collins to track data for monthly reporting.
- Mental Health/Veteran's Court Update:
  - Shirley communicated that Judge Maddox reports no unmet needs from the CJCC; CJCC does not be actively involved in specialty court modeling/implementation.
  - Timeline for the specialty court system will be reported in the April meeting.
  - Motion: For Mental Health/Veteran's Court Committee to become Transitioning Population committee, so members are able to impact efficient and outcomes of the criminal justice system. (Approved)
- Crisis Stabilization Unit Update:
  - Committee to tour the Charleston Unit on March 29, 2019, to include a presentation by Charleston stakeholders.
- Detention Center Population Review Board Update:
  - Vaughn presented minutes and infographic. (Reference related documents.)
- Community Mapping
  - Members are "cataloging" resources for an April meeting. Planning to expand the 2-1-1 system.
- Community Engagement:
  - Members assigned to other committees.
  - Will continue to work with Casey Collins to ensure participation.

## 4. Open Forum

- (Shirley) Motion: amend By-Laws to reflect the resident judge as positional leadership stakeholder rather than administrative judge. (Approved)
- (Cunningham) Gambrell Foundation funding opportunity for Mental Health Court. Requesting stakeholder letters of support, due April 1, 2019.
- (Brookshire) Conference call with Charleston County to discuss data warehousing. Charleston recommends:
  - Inventory of desired metrics.
  - Navigate legal "hurdles" (Data Use Agreements, MOUs, Confidentiality Agreements, etc.)
  - Develop infrastructure model.Based on call, warehouse will not be feasible for the 2019 Budget year.
- (Christopher) Request for Casey Collins: Copy Christopher/Capell on committee meeting invites to ensure Community Engagement membership representation.
